The 1910 Football Team Have the Intercollegiate Championship

The Work of All the Men is Yery Creditable to Them

Alma has finished her most successful football season in eight years. Not since the championship days of 1902 have teams representing the Maroon and Cream on the gridiron brought honors to be greatly missed, for the past season scrap of the year-Ewing, Harwood and likeness of William Winton 'C' and the many strong teams have represented Alma in the past few years, many notable victories have been gained, and every year our teams have stood high among the colleges, but this year the victories were decisive and complete and as the Detroit News has said: "Alma may rightfully claim to be champions of Michigan's minor colleges."

Many Alma supporters are wont to claim the M.I.A.A. championship for Alma, while Olivet protesting, because she played the greater number of games, lays claim to the championship. We would remind both Alma and Olivet supporters that there is no M.I.A.A football championship as specifically laid down by the association.

However Alma is a member of the M.I.A.A. and as such she must be considered in the championship 'dope.' Alma's unquestionable superiority over Olivet, as shown by the 14-3 score, ranks our team above the Crimson, and Olivet's claim to the championship only furthers and more securely establishes the Maroons as champs. But Alma prefers to abide by the M.I.A.A. "blue book" and for herself only asks to be rightfully acknowledged the champions of Michigan's minor colleges.

The Almanian early predicted a successful season for the Maroons. This prediction was not the usual stereotyped optimistic view. We recognized in our coach an exceptionally capable man, we knew the many veterans of last year's team would present a defensive line that would be almost inpenetrable, while in Capt. Kefgen we saw a strong leader. To Cook's boot we trusted the play to be kept from the danger zone. Then there were some splendid new men, and as has been proved by the team's record, our prediction was fulfilled. The excellent record cannot be attributed to any one of these things, but harmony, hard work and excellent judgment, more nearly accounts for the success.


