Alma was never in danger from the visitors having a score of 26 to 0 when the first half White had net even made a serious threat. <br> Playing the best brand of football shown so far this season the team went into the fray to demonstrate evidently to its supporters that it has championship capabilities and it showed them, picking off two touchdowns in each of the first two quarters. Alma started early, forcing the kickoff. Alma took the ball on the Hillsdale 47 and marched back on linesmashing by H. Catherman and Beam to the 15 yard line, where McDonald attempted a field goal on the fourth down from a wide angle. The attempt failed. Hillsdale immediately punted out of danger and then following an exchange of punts Alma took the ball on her own 45 yard line and by linesmashing carried the ball down the field, Beam contributing 27 of the yards needed on a single linesmash. McDonald went the final three yards for the touchdown. He failed to kick over the extra point. Alma 6, Hillsdale 0. <br> Alma kicked to Hillsdale and following an exchange of punts, "Dud" Jchnson glomed onto a Hillsdale fumble on the Hillsdale 33 yard line and raced to the goal for the second touchdown. McDonald dropkicked the goal. Alma 13, Hillsdale 0. Soon after this touchdown the quarter ended with Alma in possession of the ball on the Alma 43 yard mark. <br> Alma opened the second quarter with passes, after an offside penalty. McDonald heaved one to Johnston for 22 yards, and then a short one to Beam for 3 more. Hillsdale interfered on the next and it was ruled complete on the visitors 12 yard line.
