believes such methods develop self-
reliance and self-direction in the stu-
dent. However, he pointed out, Amer-
ican students are not prepared for
such a course. The European stu-
dents fit into it because of their pre-
paratory work and strict discipline.

lege arrives at in his book "The Stu lege arrives at in his book, "The Stu-
dent Who Smokes," based on a statisdical study of the problem. These general conclusions are drawn from his study:
"The smoker smokes because it is
a social habit. He has low sho a social habit. He has low scholar-
ship because he is sociable. Scholarship demands the exercise of attention which cuts off the individual from his fellow. This solitude of mind is incompatible with the grega-
rious instinct rious instinct. ambition.
"That some poison or poisons in the smoke acting upon the central nervous system produces a deteriora-
tion of nervous tissue leading directly to a lower mental output."
