Tresbyterian missionary college at Tsinanfu, Shantung, China, and a member of the class of 1889 of Al-
ma College, and her husband, the ma College, and her husband, the
Rev. J. C. Stam, and her two months old baby were kidnapped
by bandits in southern Anhwei by bandits in
province, China.

The parents were murdered by
the bandits, but

of the baby is as yet unknown. of the baby is as yet unknown.
Their bodies were found ncar Tsingteh in Southern Anhwei province, where they have been sta-
