In the past few years there has been introduced into intercollegiate debating a "cross questioning" method which has greatly increased the interest and value of debate, for keener study of the subject.

This procedure calls for a speech from each member of to a questioning from the other side. In this way many issues that might otherwise be ignored are forced into discussion, and the debate ceases to be a speech of the two coaches' viewpoints as is so often the case today

taking part and the interest of those who come to hear them, which, sadly enough, are very few in number, for debates have too often ceased to be debates at all, but only four well framed and well memorized speeches and a few jokes. Too often one side will completely ignore the issues of the other and in the end we have two good cases established, but no attempt on the part of either side to tear down the issues of their opponents.
The "cross questioning" method eliminates this to a very The "cross questioning" method eliminates this to a very
great extent. The bombardment that each team has to meet great extent. The bombardment that each team has to meet
brings out clearly many things that can be ignored otherwise brings out clearly many things that can be ignored otherwise
and that are deciding points in the debate. It eliminates talkand that are deciding points in the debate. It eliminates talk-
ing around the point and it either makes or breaks a case and ing around the point and it either makes or breaks a case and
does not leave it hanging in mid air as so many debates are left today.

We feel that this method which is gaining popularity so rapidly in the larger institutions of the country should at least We are also strongly in favor of its adoption by the League as the style or method for future debates on the grounds that we have already stressed and because we think that it may provide the necessary spark to debating that will arouse student interest and bring better audiences.
