WOMEN IN DENTISTRY

ACP Feature Service

Detroit, Mich .- (ACP) Women dentists, as scarce now as women welders were before Pearl Harbor, will appear in the future in everincreasing numbers, Professor Charles W. Creaser, chairman of the pre-medical and pre-dental committee at Wayne university predicts.

Professor Creaser points out that of more than 1,400 dentists now practicing in Detroit, only 12 are women, and that throughout the country there are 35 men in the profession for every woman.

"The skill which women in war industries are displaying in the manipulation of small tools," said Professor Creaser, "gives ample evidence of their aptitude for at least one phase of dental work. Furthermore, we know that the few women who have entered the Kappa Iota will formally ini- profession have proved exception-


