## A Case for Consideration

Sincere educators often make the statement that a college is judged by those who attend it. We have been led to believe that these hallowed words refer only to the student. This is a common misconception. There is another personage at the college whom we shall designate as "the instructor." The inatructor is one who imparts knowledge. We grant that this is his chief function. But what else is called for by the instructor's contract? Perhaps there is nothing elsewritten. We must consider, however, that which is not put down in black and white-the unwritten part of the contract.

There is probably nothing in paragraph one which stipulates that the instructor is to give guidance and encouragement to the atudent who falters. That clause shouldn't be necemisary.

Therse sh pracebly nothing in paragraph two which disecte that the sustructor must help organize and counsel activitifs. That chans shouldn't be necessary.

Therf 44 phasafoly nothing in paragraph three which requirea an inutructor to set an example by the integrity of his conduct.

Surely the instructor has as large a share in the eolloge as the student. To have pride in his position, he must have pride in the institution that employs him. If there is astm structor who does not realize this, then it is to him we zpeak. We point these things out as a friendly reminder. We do ngt
make implications; we do not criticize. We are not stating that anyone in any college is at fault.

This is not a matter of fact; it is a matter of conseience.

## Individual Student Responsibility

Many students feel that there is a short-cut to konw
They desire to achieve wisdom instantaneously. Too edge. They desire to achieve wisdom instantaneousiy. Too they can display the symptoms of wisdom. They become irritated with requirements, bored by prescribed courses, and restlese because they cannot proceed at once to do advanced work before they are cognizant of the fundamentals. They consider that the chief function of their education is to assist them in rationalizing their prejudices. The student should be constantly on the alert to remind himself that knowledge must precede opinion.

The successful student must have a sincere sense of integrity, not only toward his academic work, but also toward the ideals and traditions of the college. This is a matter of living up to a code of social behavior as well as meeting the academic prerequisites for a college degree.

The student who has the ability to assimilate facts and relate them to knowledge, the will to work, and a sense o moral and social obligation, should find his college career profitable and pleasant one. It is the responsibility of student to see to it that his years in college prove to dividual student to
