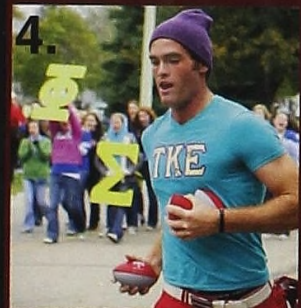

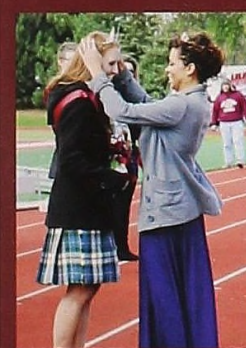

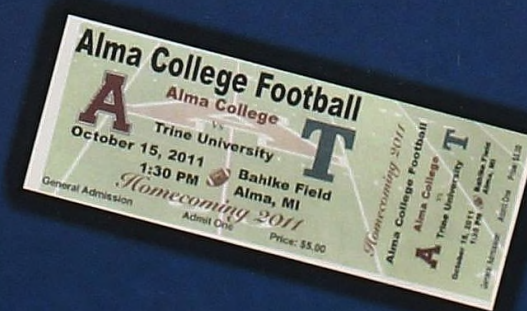

Orientation Week - Freshman Class of 2015

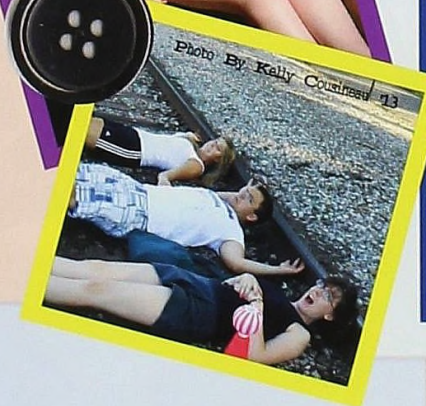
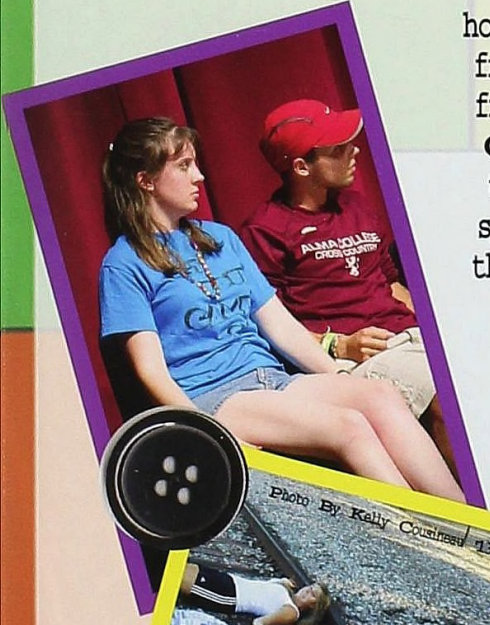

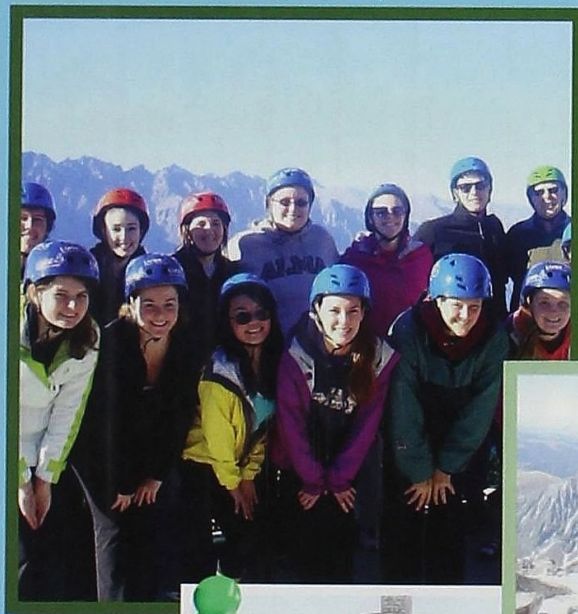

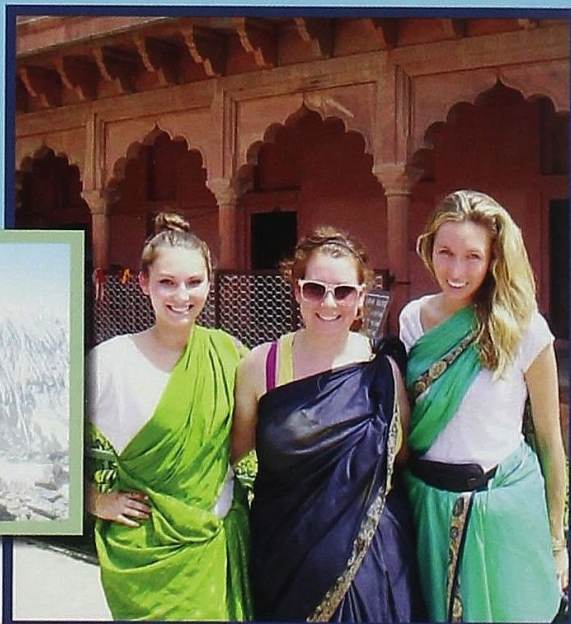

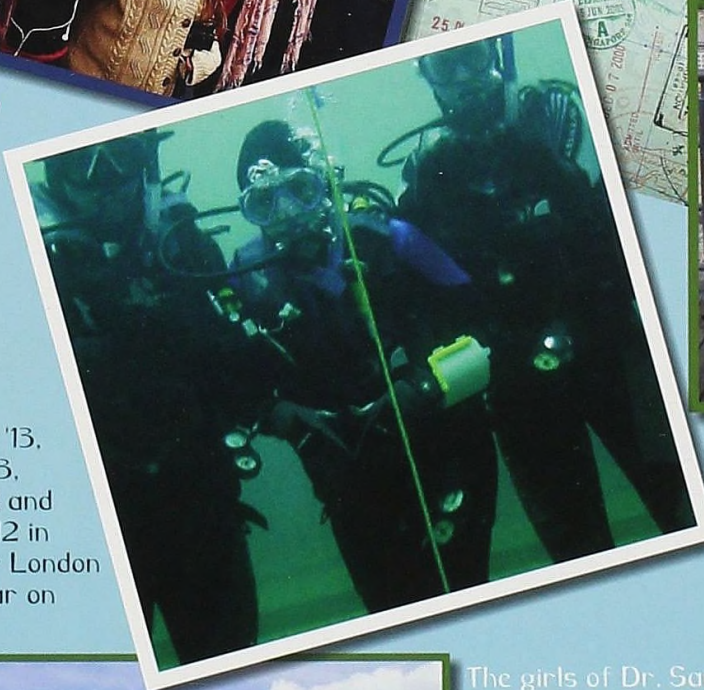
