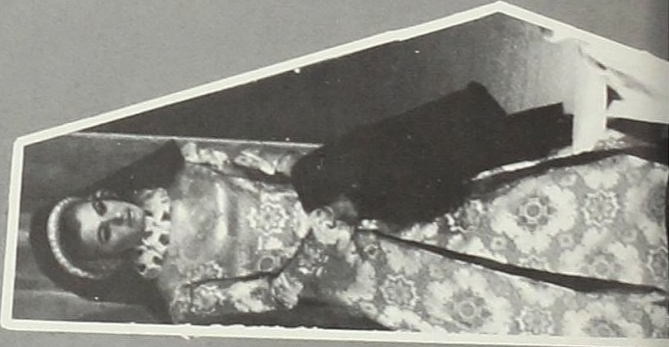
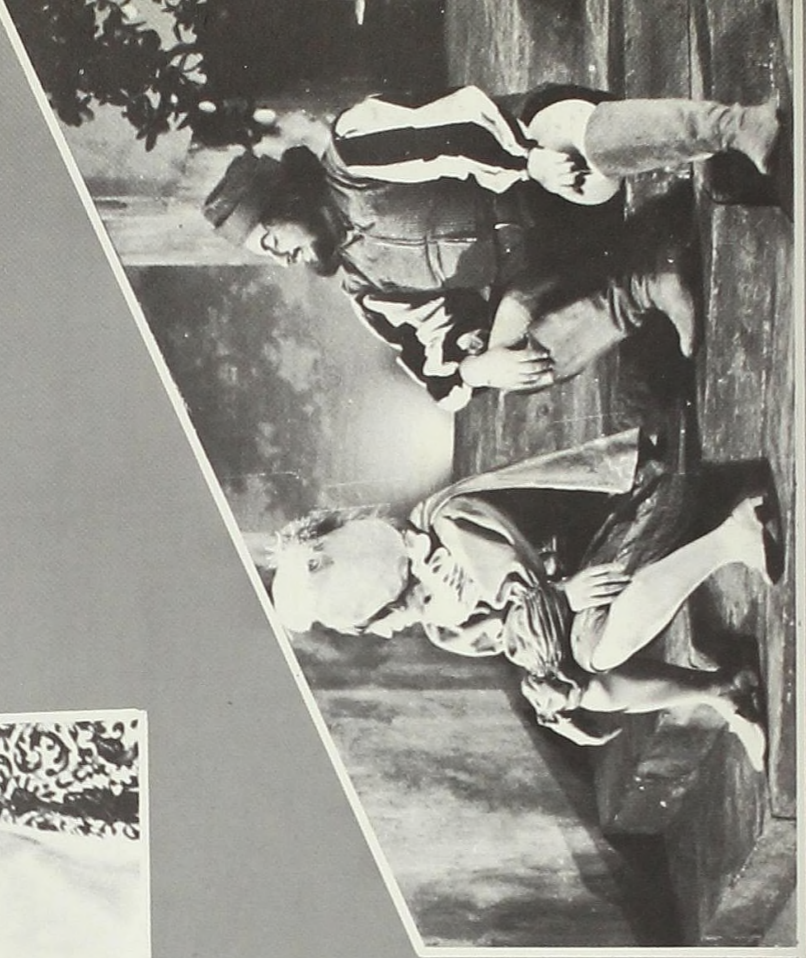


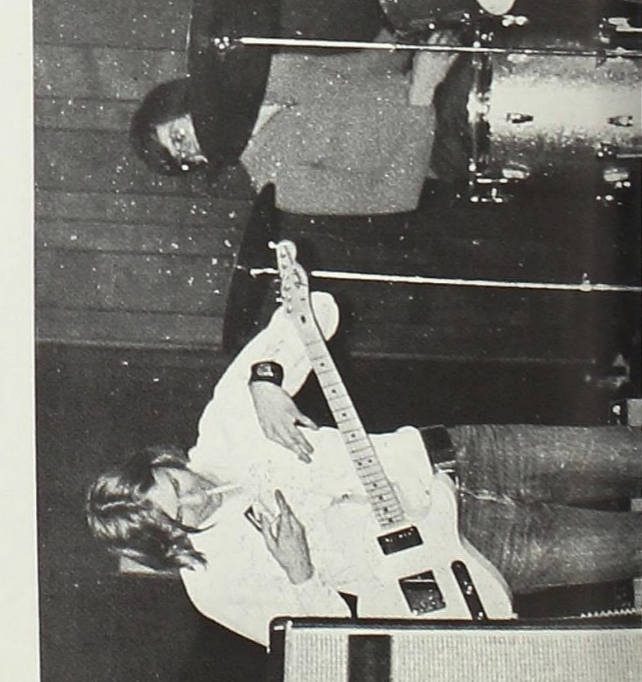
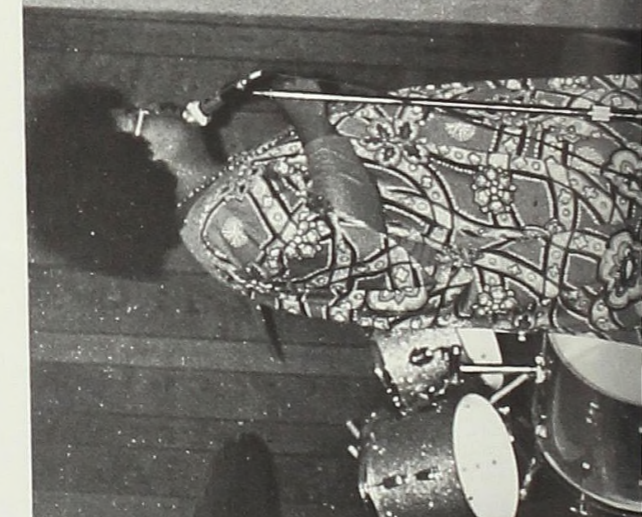
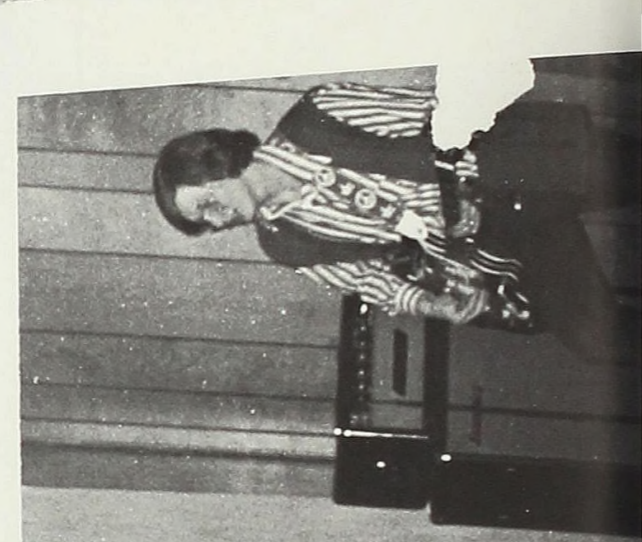
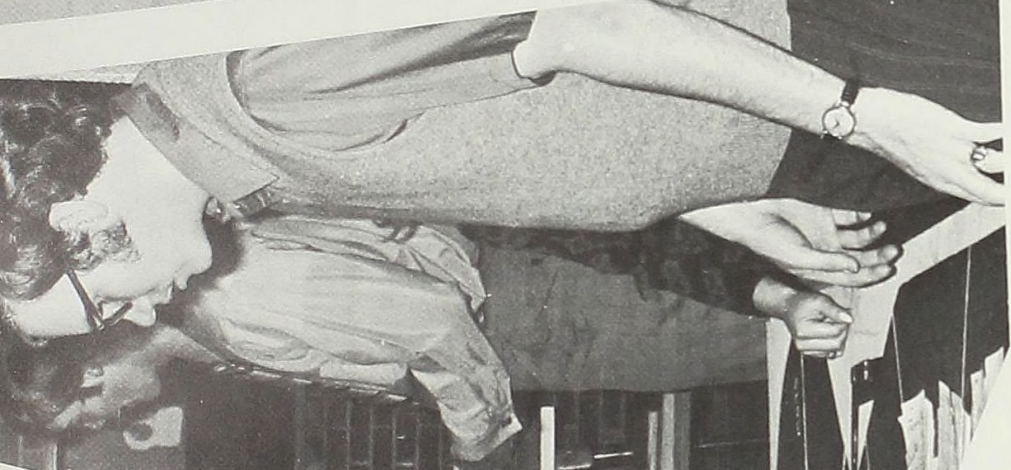








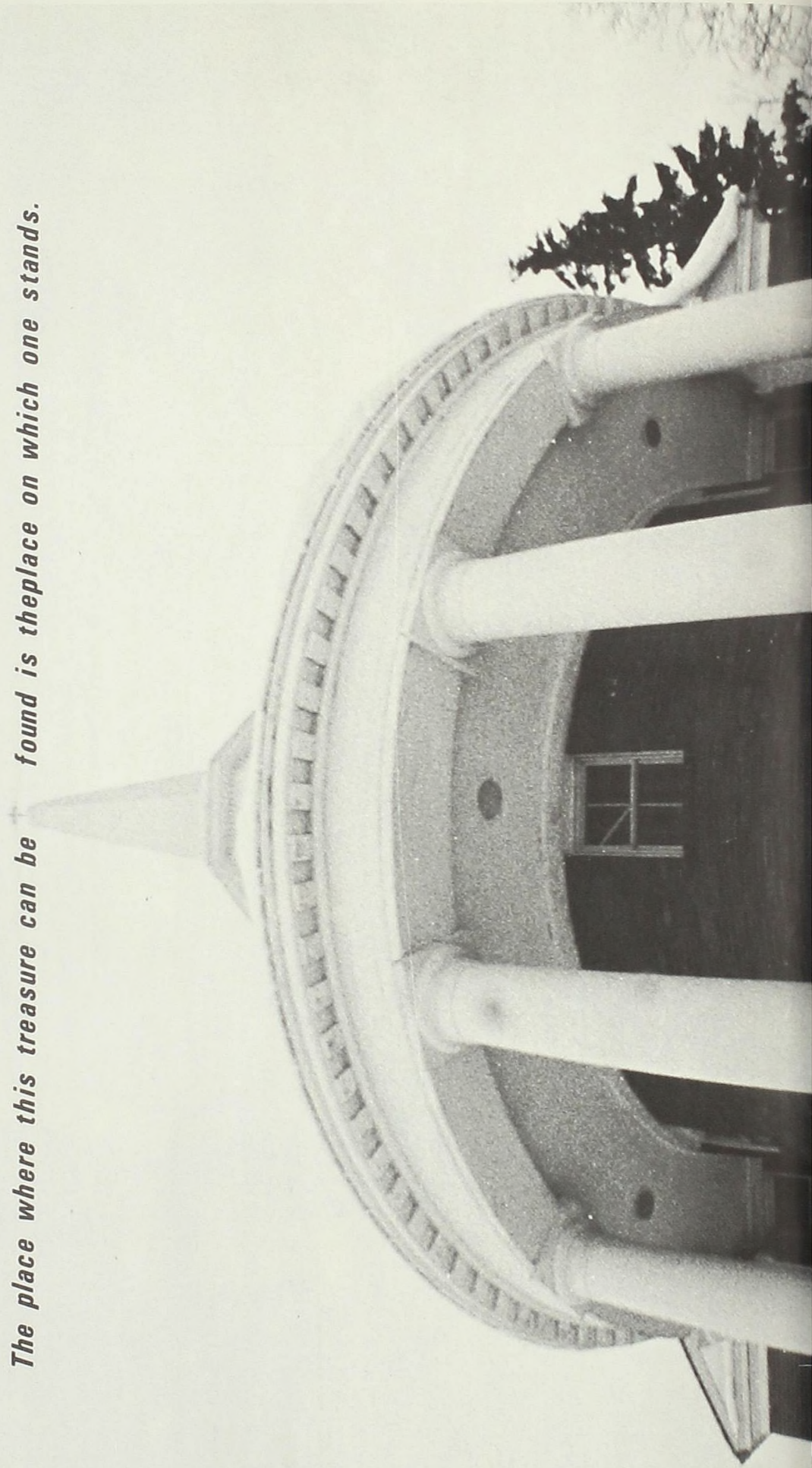




There is something that can only be found in one place. It is a great
