Mongol invaders and long slender hands.

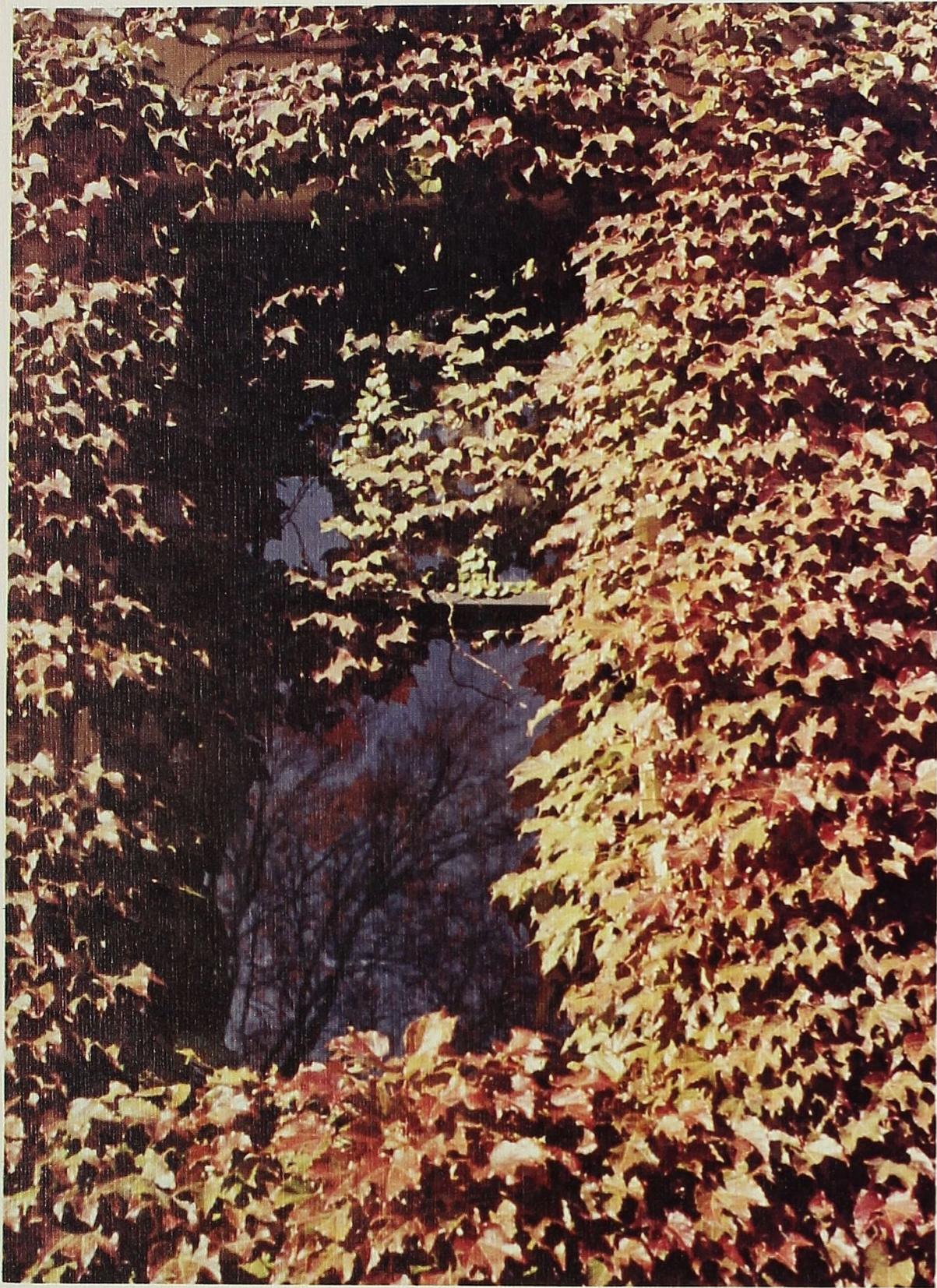
Where is the moon? Ask me in January

emotionless for what will come.

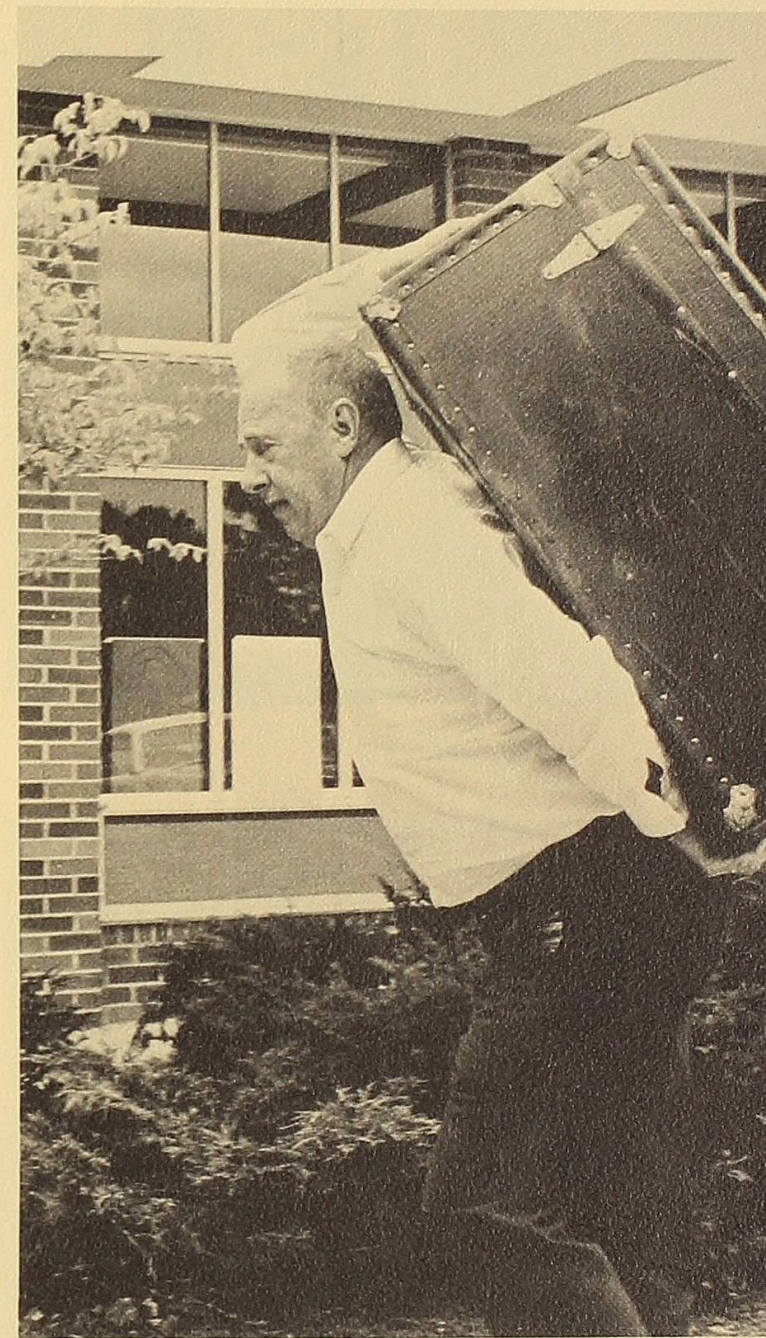

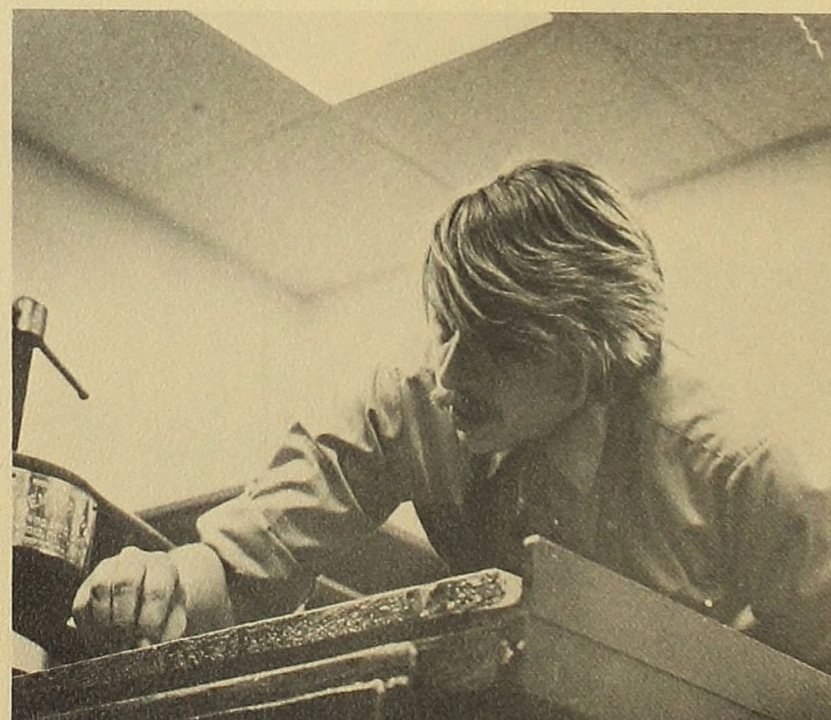
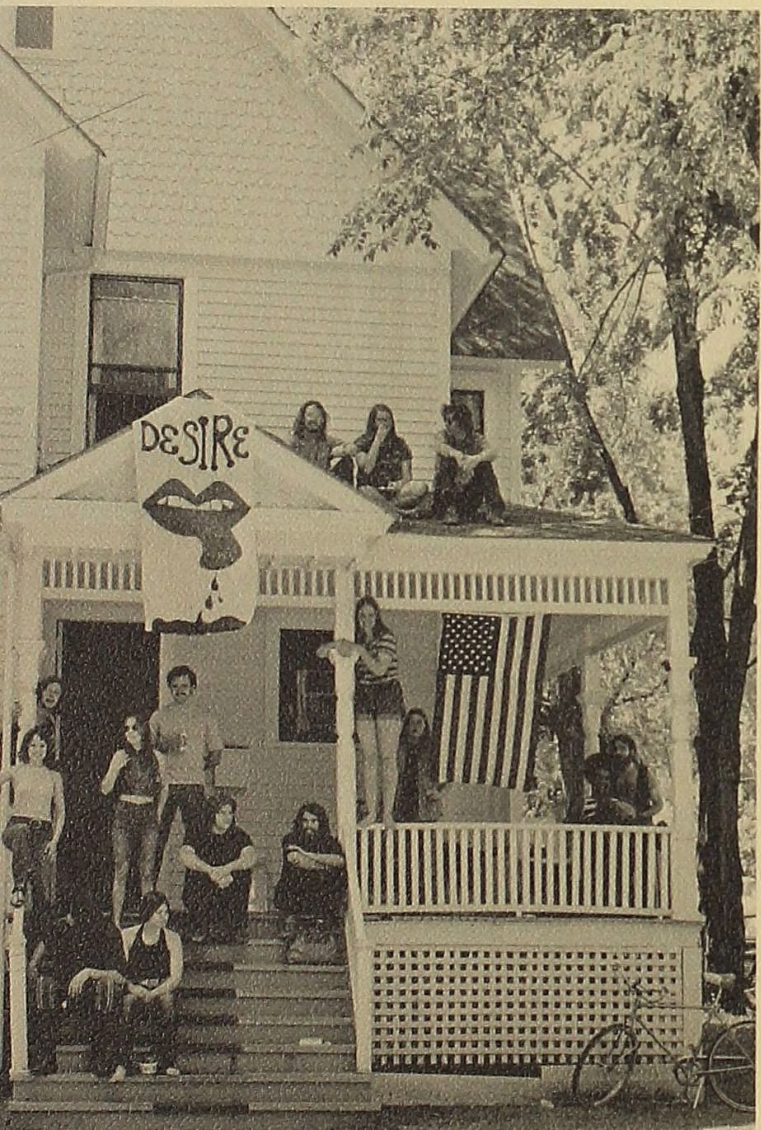

She bursts into new detail.

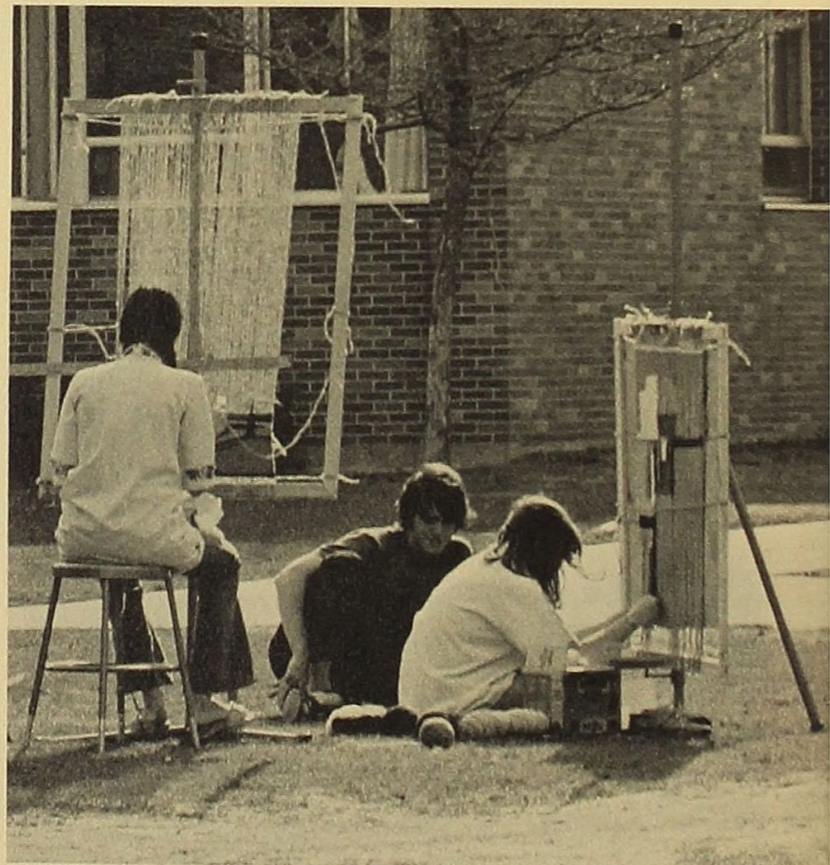
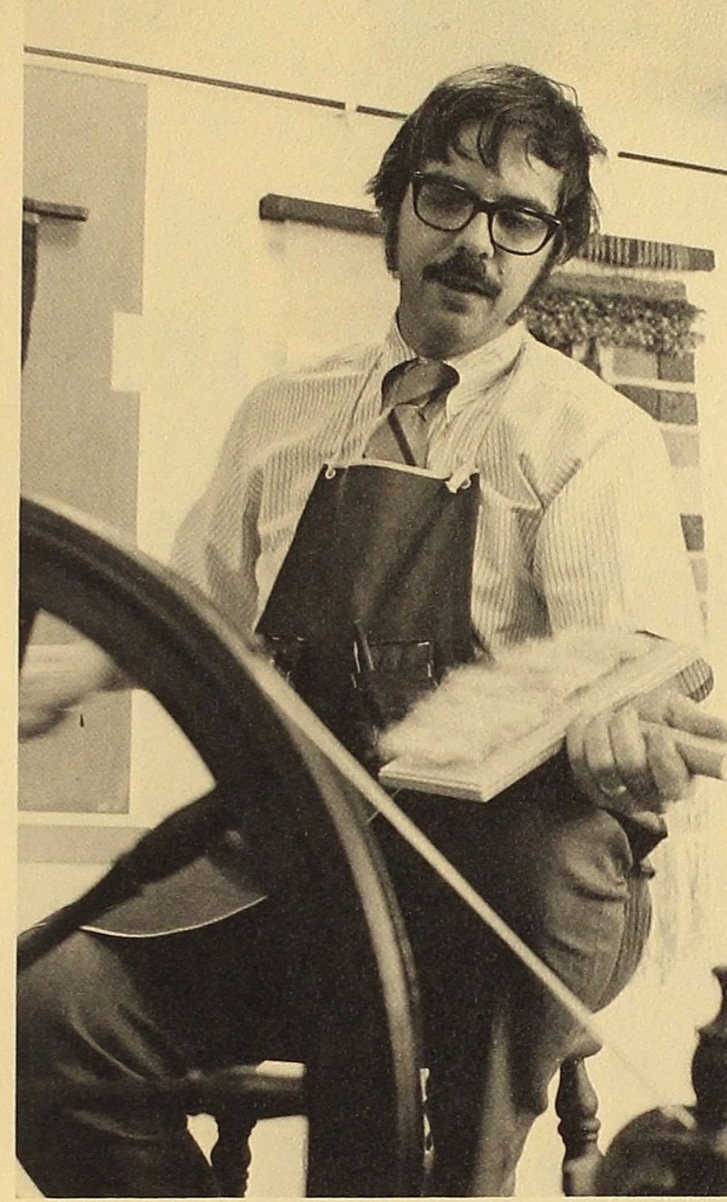

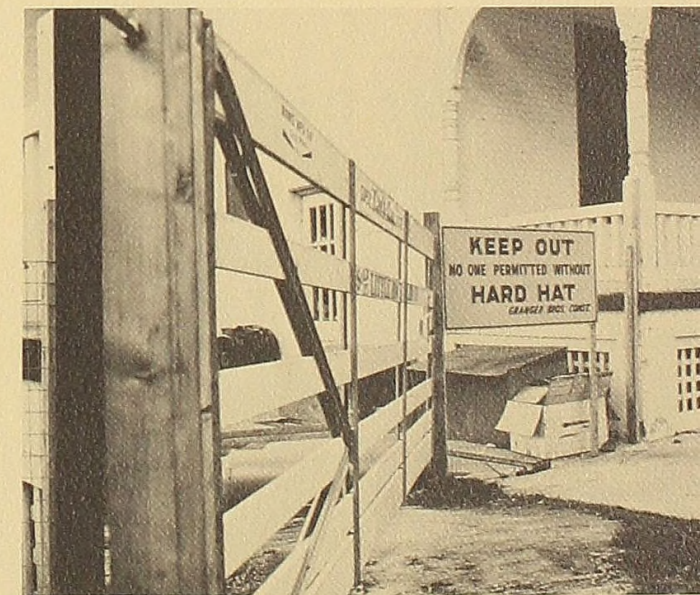
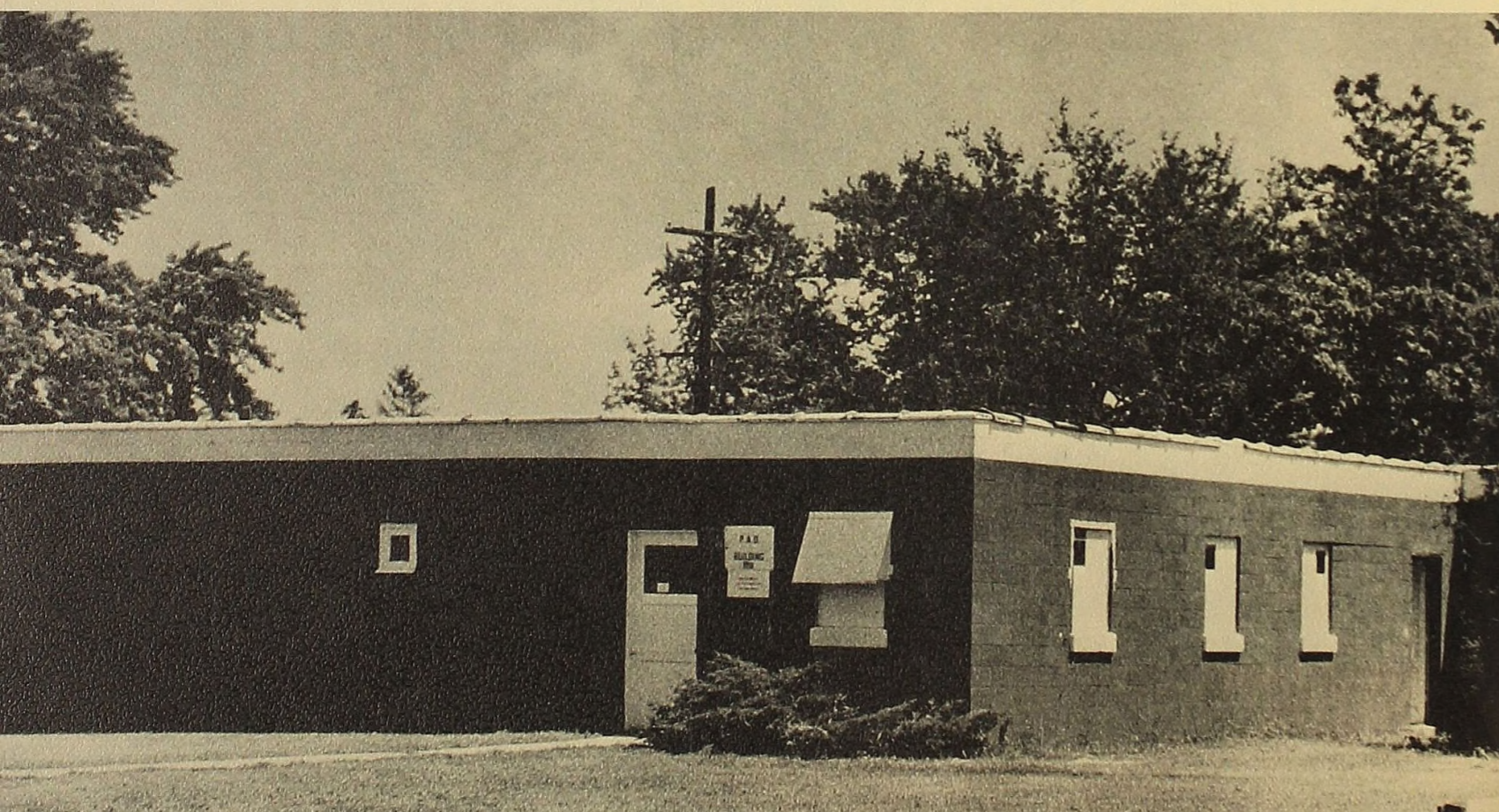
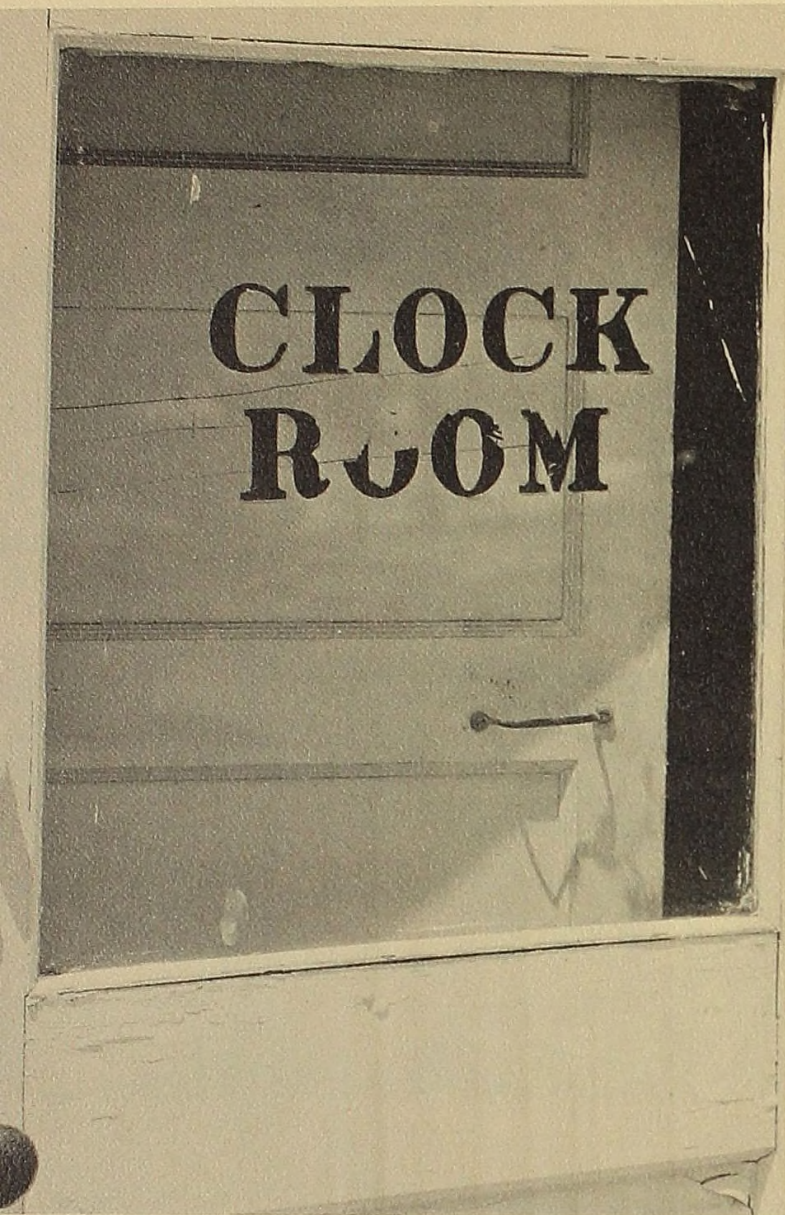


ART POEM NO. 1

thus grabbing his attention.

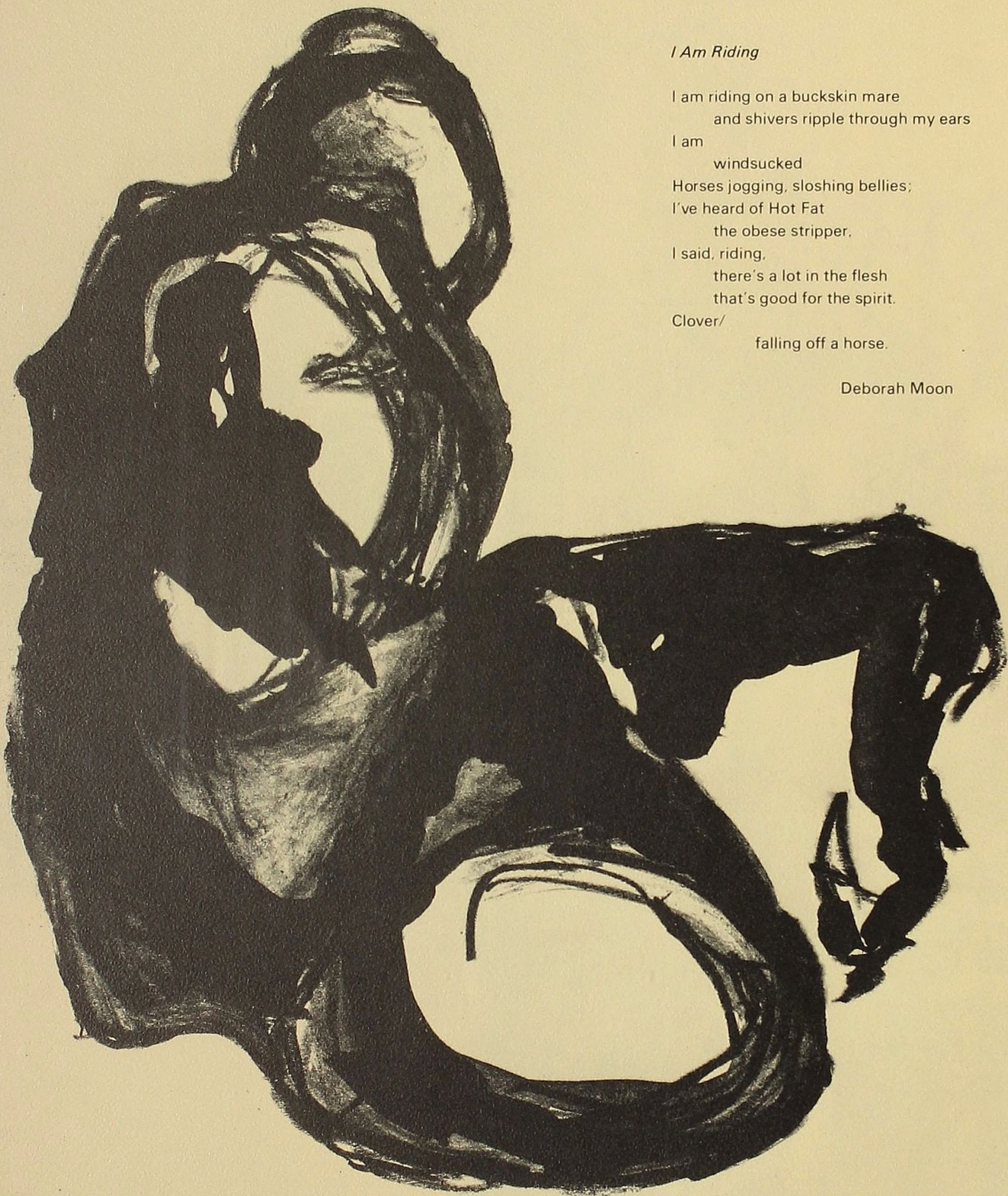
Yea, I suppose God notices it.
