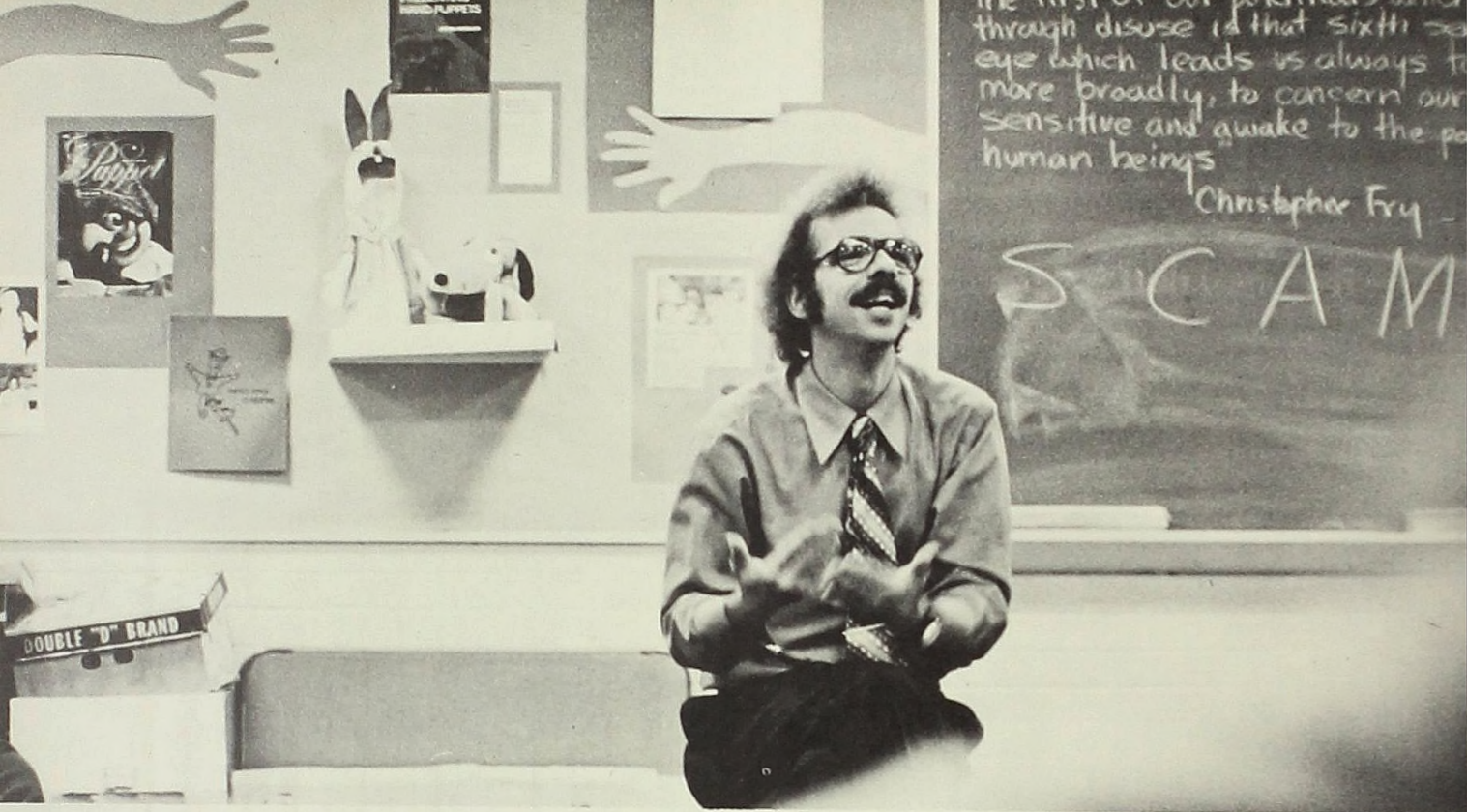




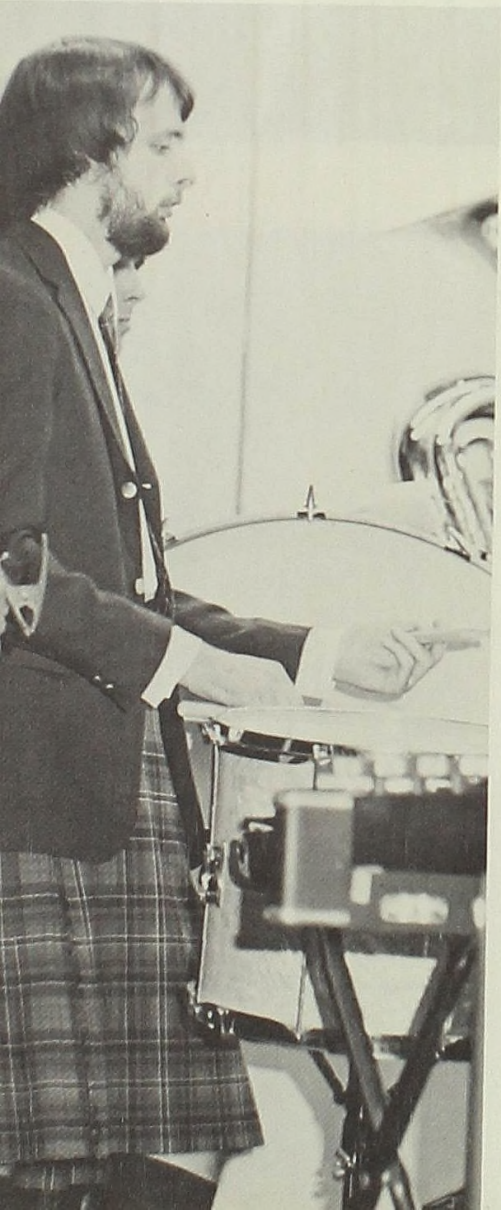
We have been called actors on a stage. That picture somehow does not suffice, for we would be more. We are more, we are artists participating in an evolving skill, the art of communication.





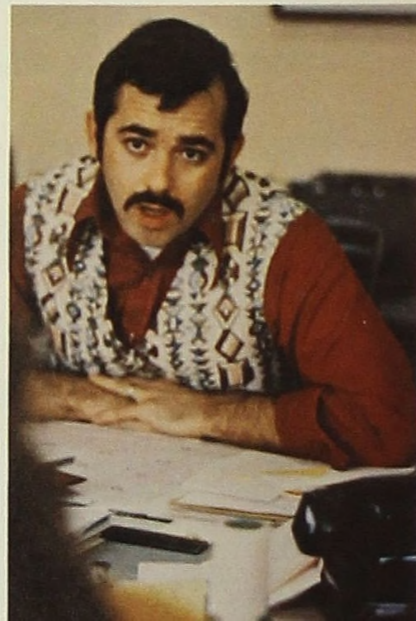


To communicate is vital, and it is our business. We share the same ground, under the same atmosphere, and as we grow alone we grow together.

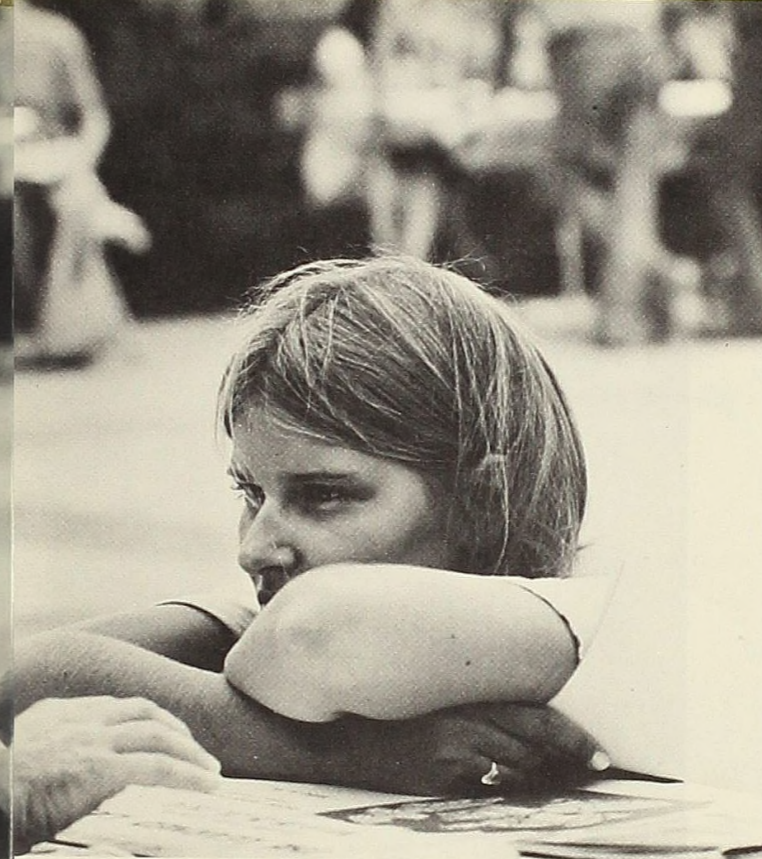
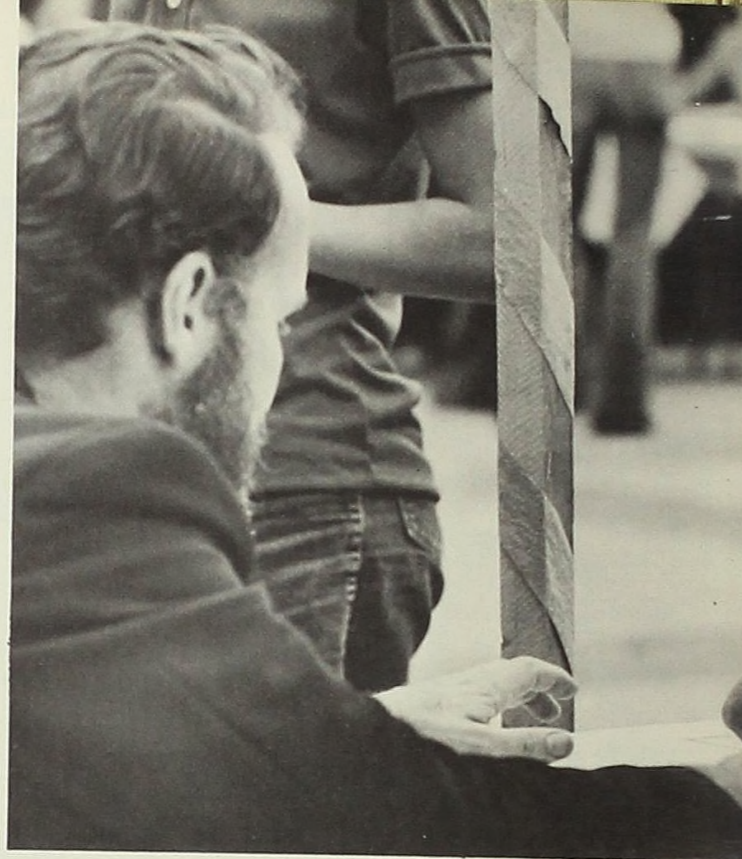

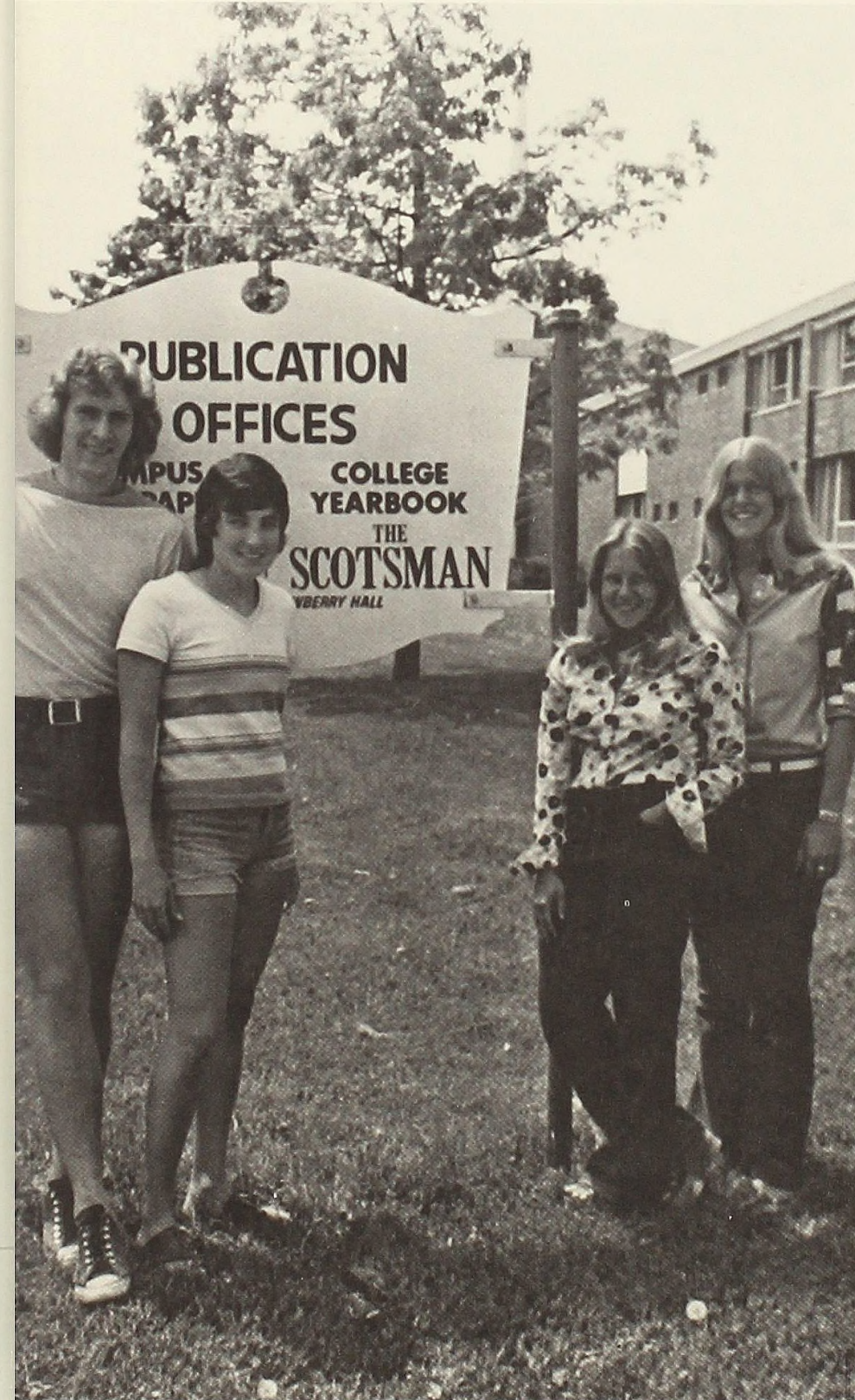


# BETA BETA BETA

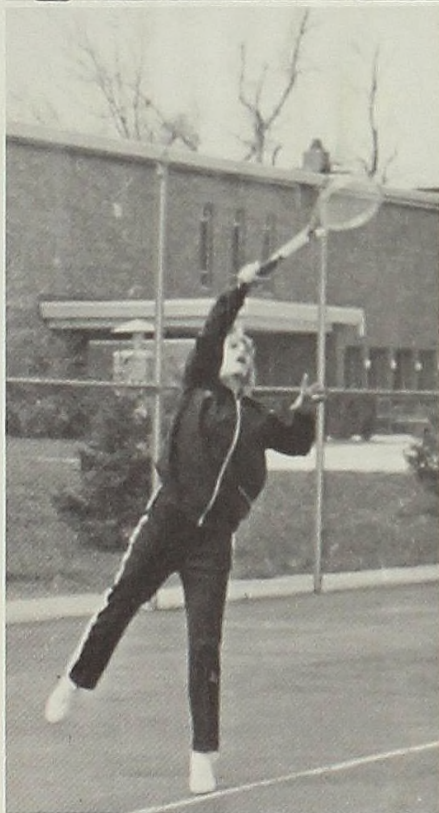
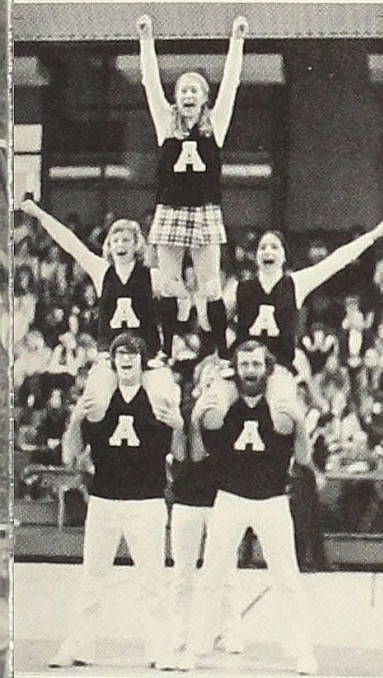
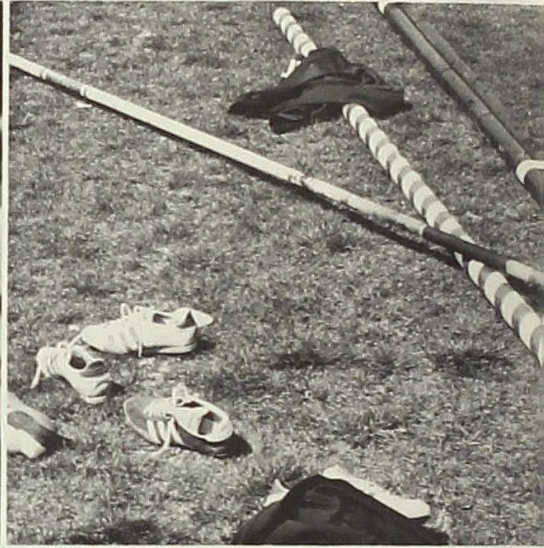
# THETA CHI LITTLE SISTERS

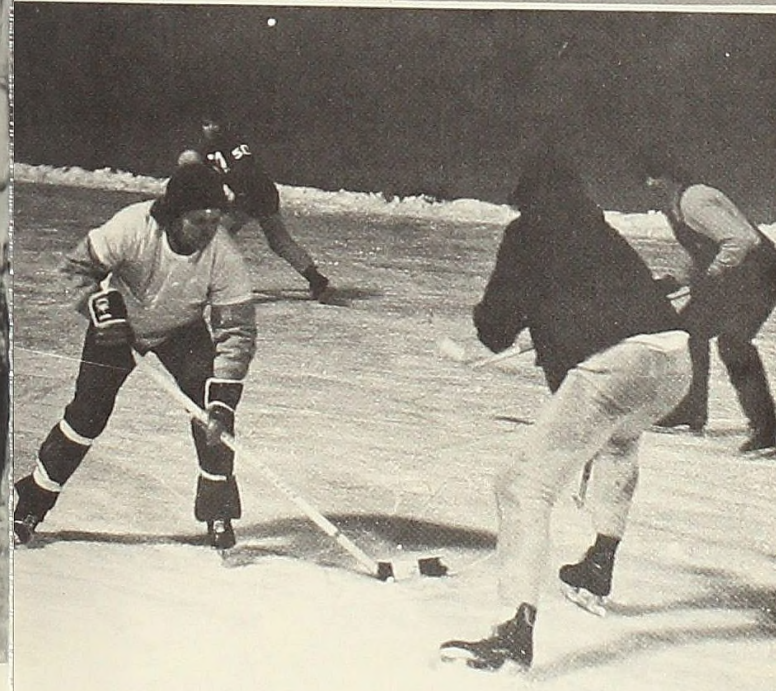

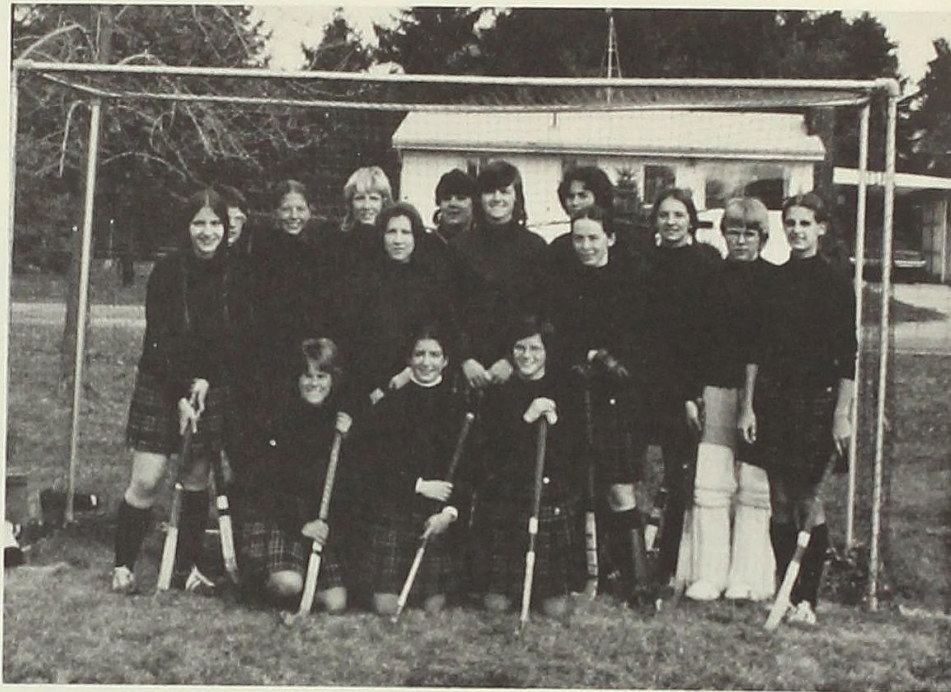

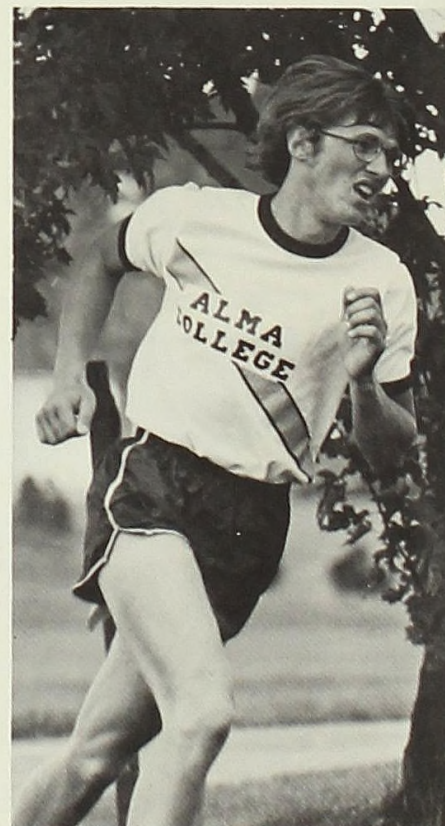


## Cross Country

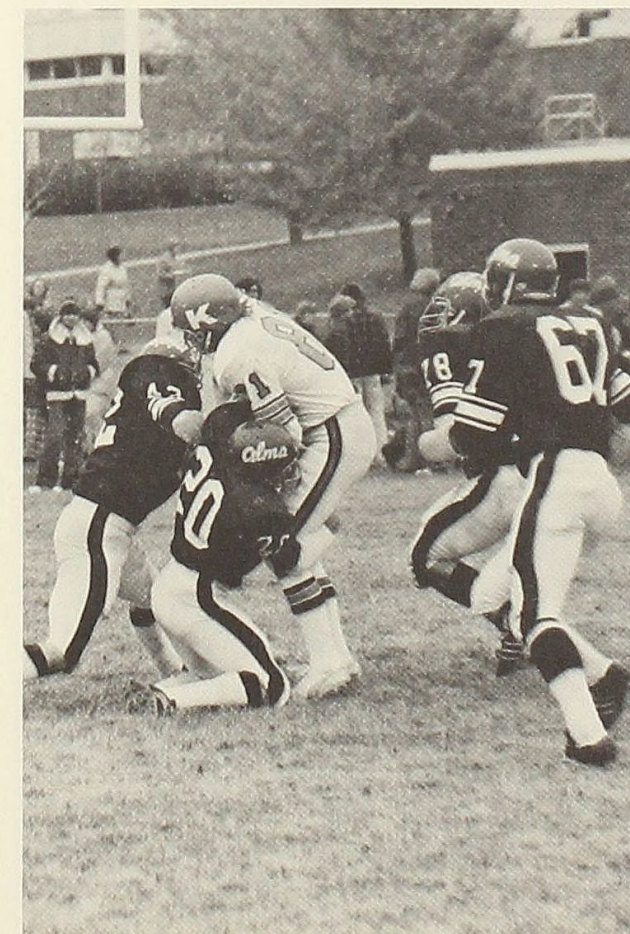
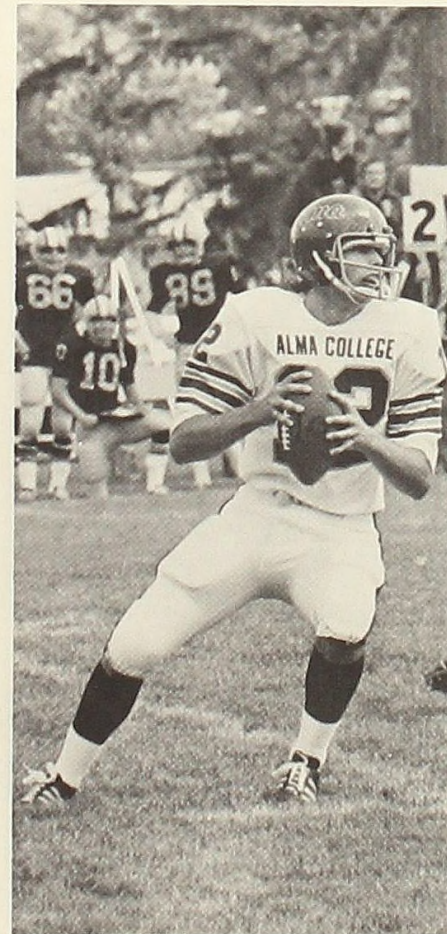

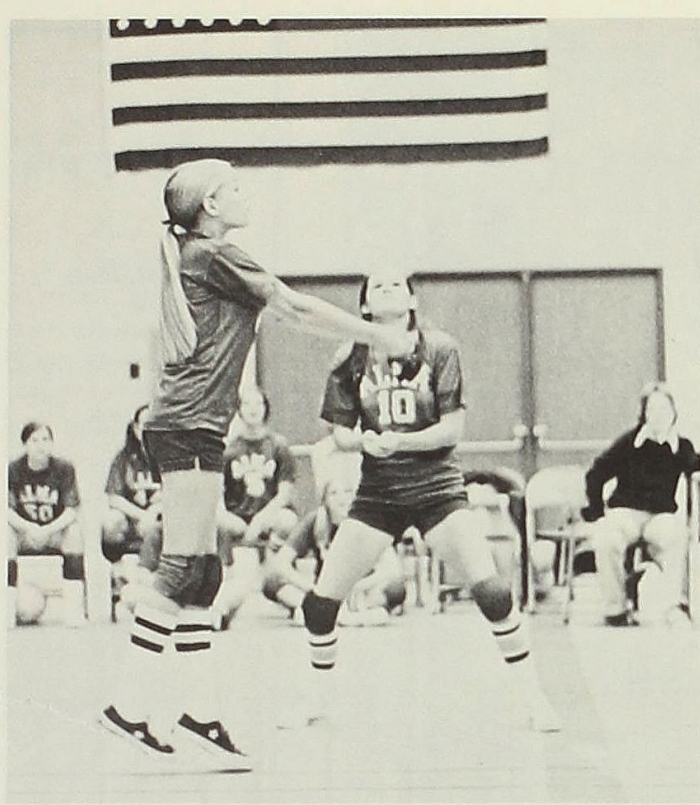

Next year Soccer will be played as a Varsity sport for the first time at Alma College.

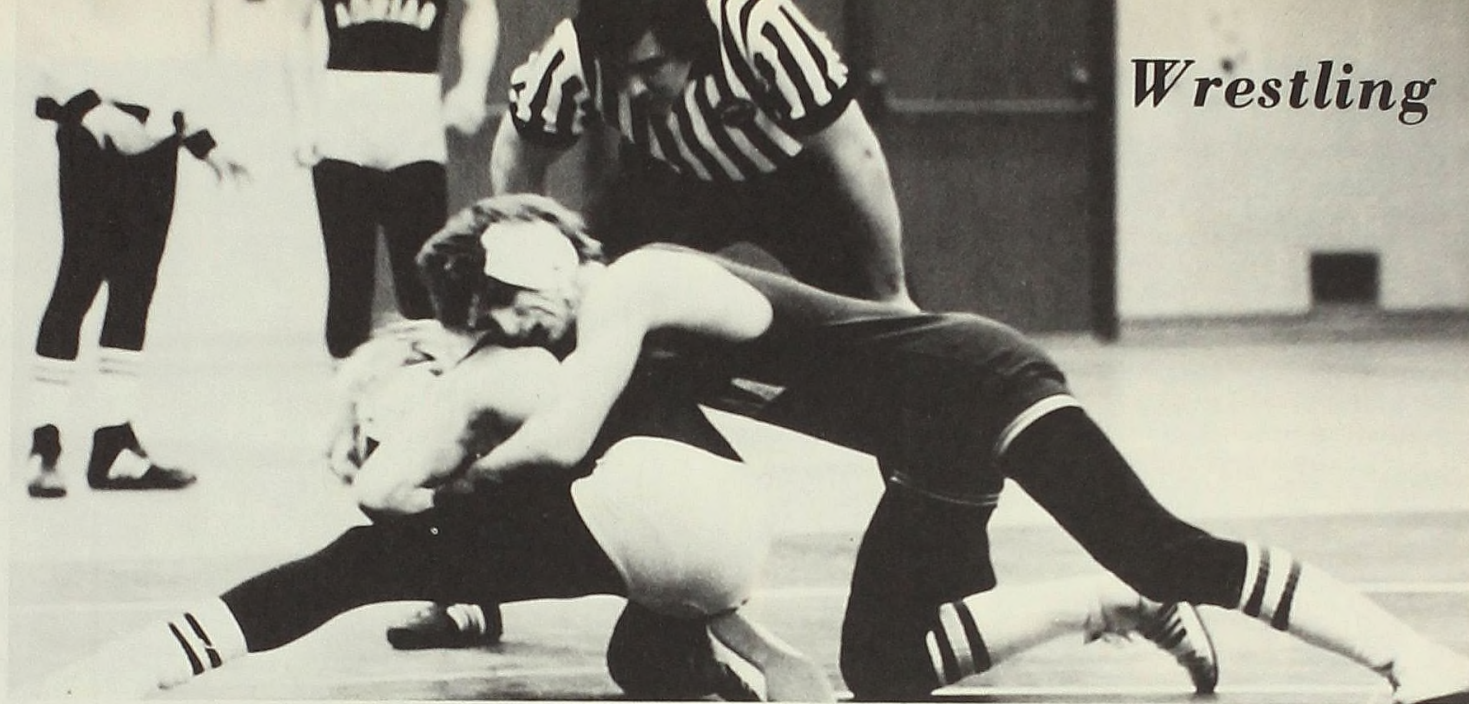

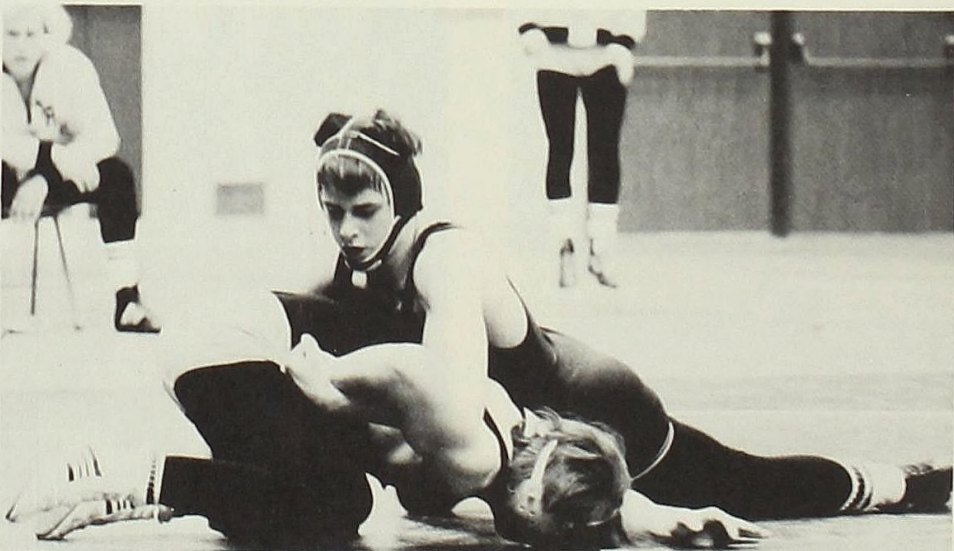






# Wrestling

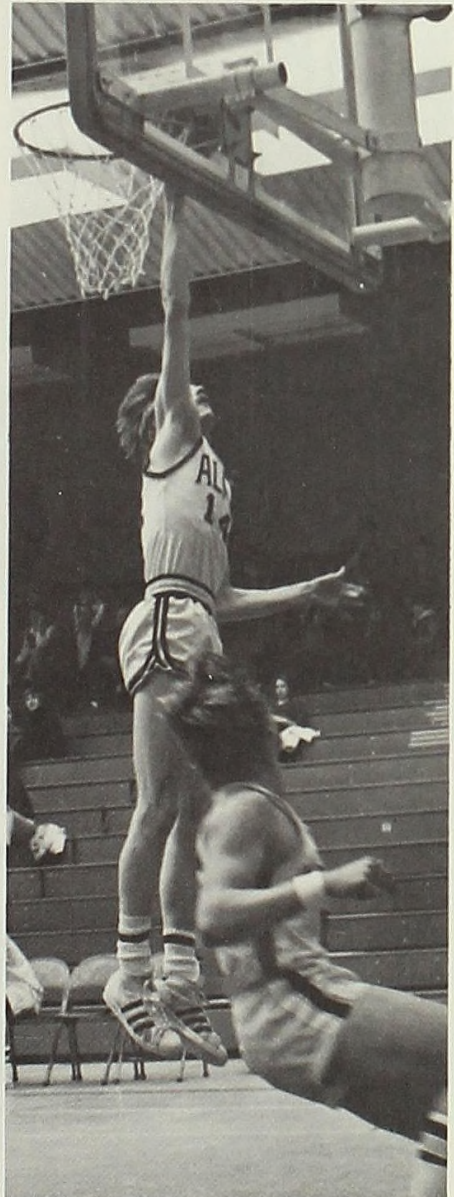
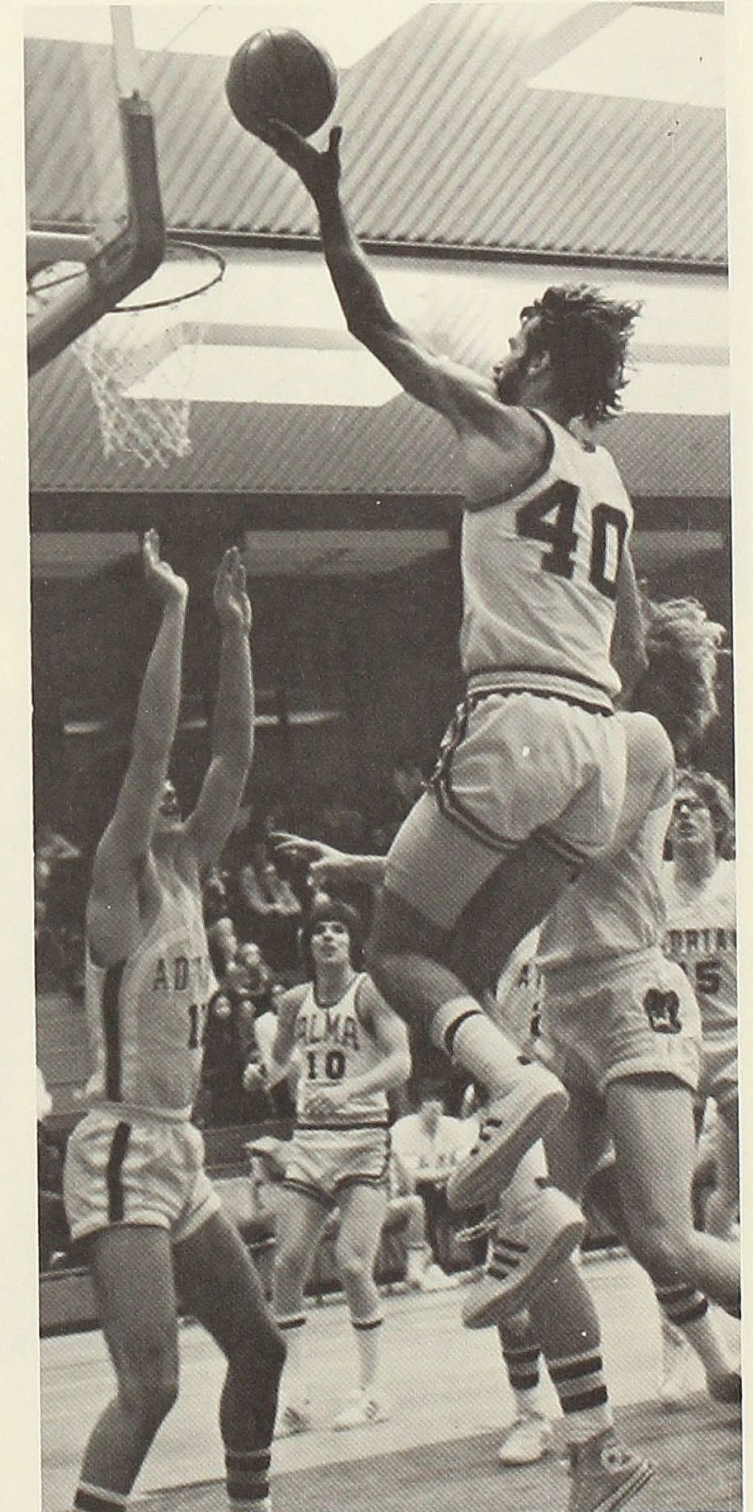
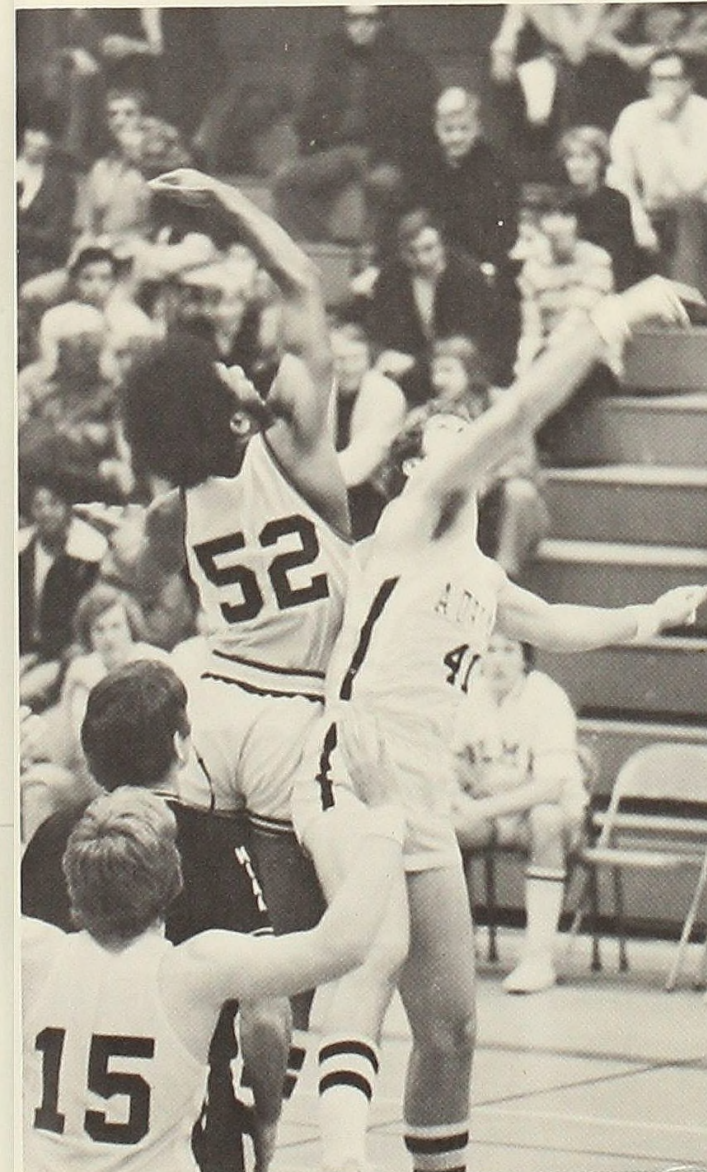
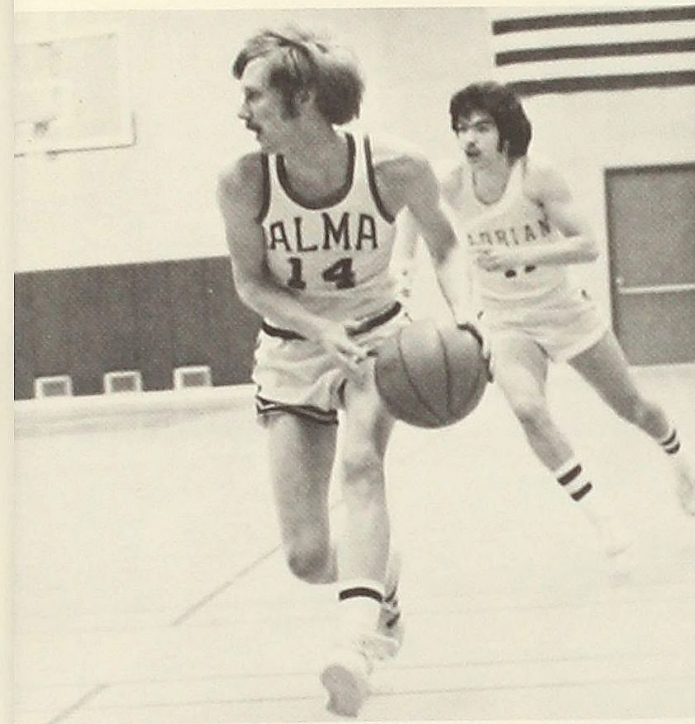
# Basketball

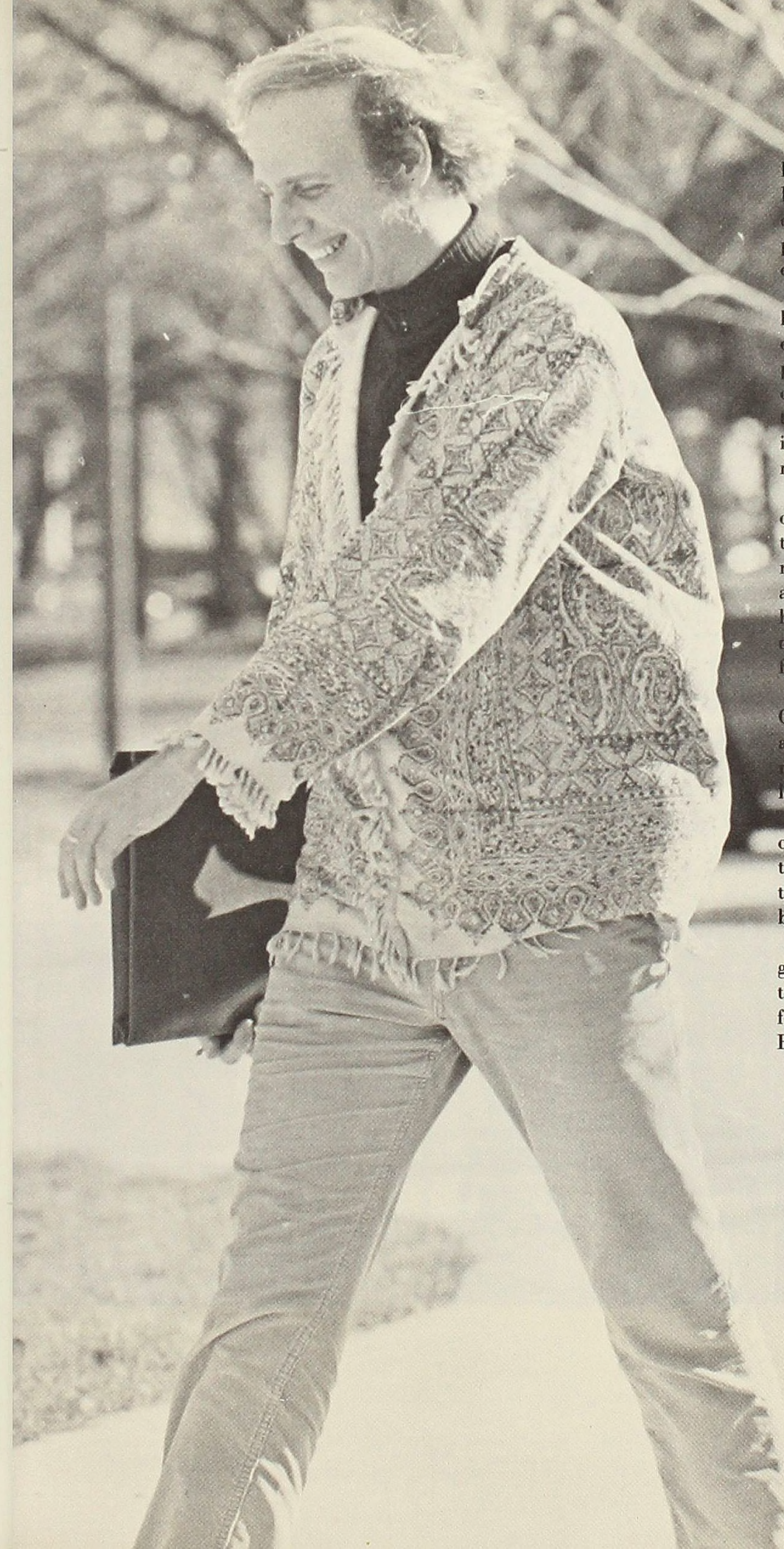
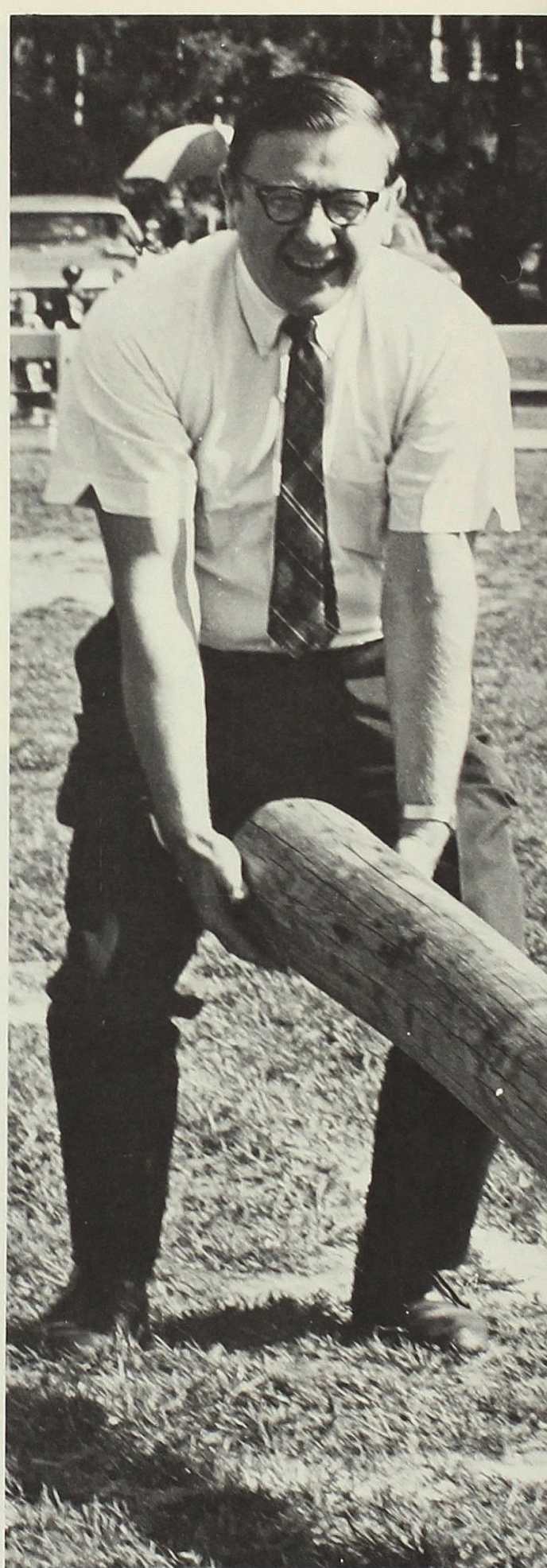
IN MEMORY OF DR. JOHN KIMBALL

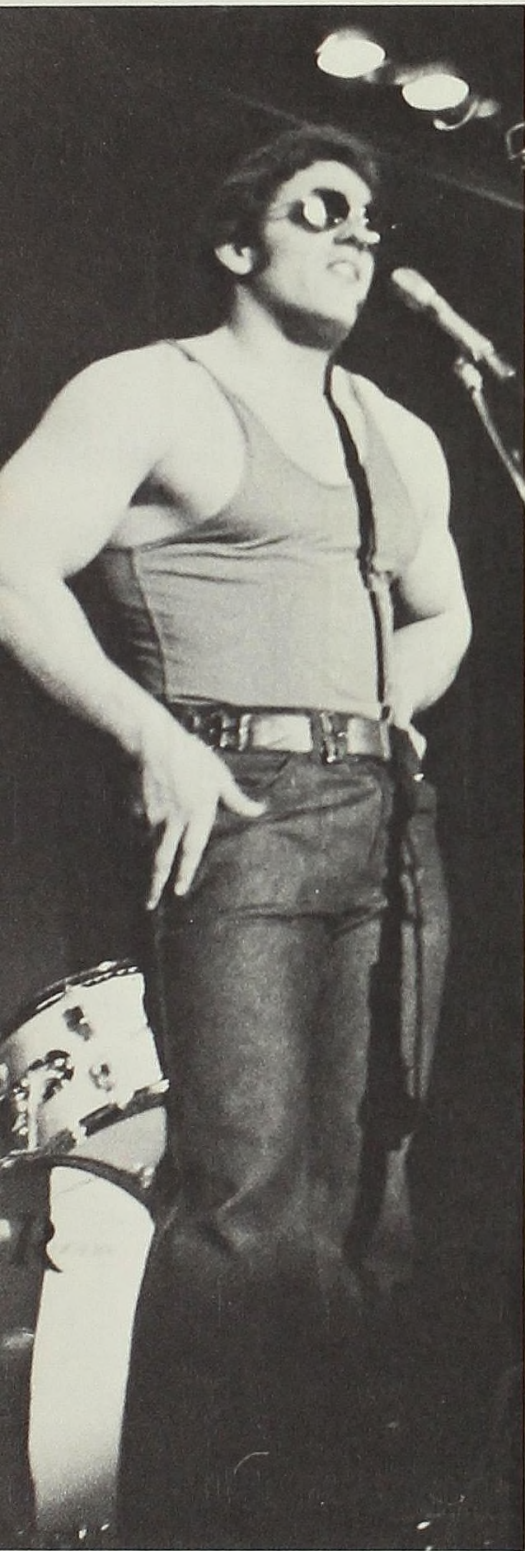

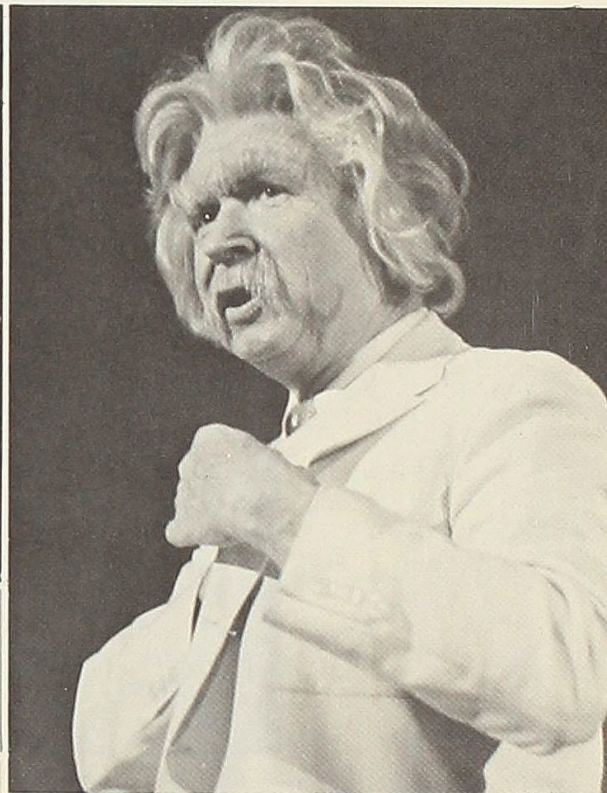

The Alma Symphony is made up of members exclusively comprised of students and Gratiot County personnel. With the support of the Michigan Council for the Arts, three nationally recognized artists were engaged as soloists for the 1974-1975 season. In the first concert of the year, guest soloist was Barbara Long, a flutist who received her Bachelor of Music degree from Miami University and a Master of Music degree from U of M. The guest soloist for the winter concert was Martha Naset, pianist who is in the process of receiving her doctorate degree from U of M. The third concert was marked with student soloists as the guest soloist was not able to attend. The last concert of the year was the highly popular Pops-Cabaret Concert.

The 1974-1975 season marked fifteen years since the orchestra's origin. The orchestra now has personnel and financial resources drawn from the entire Gratiot County.
