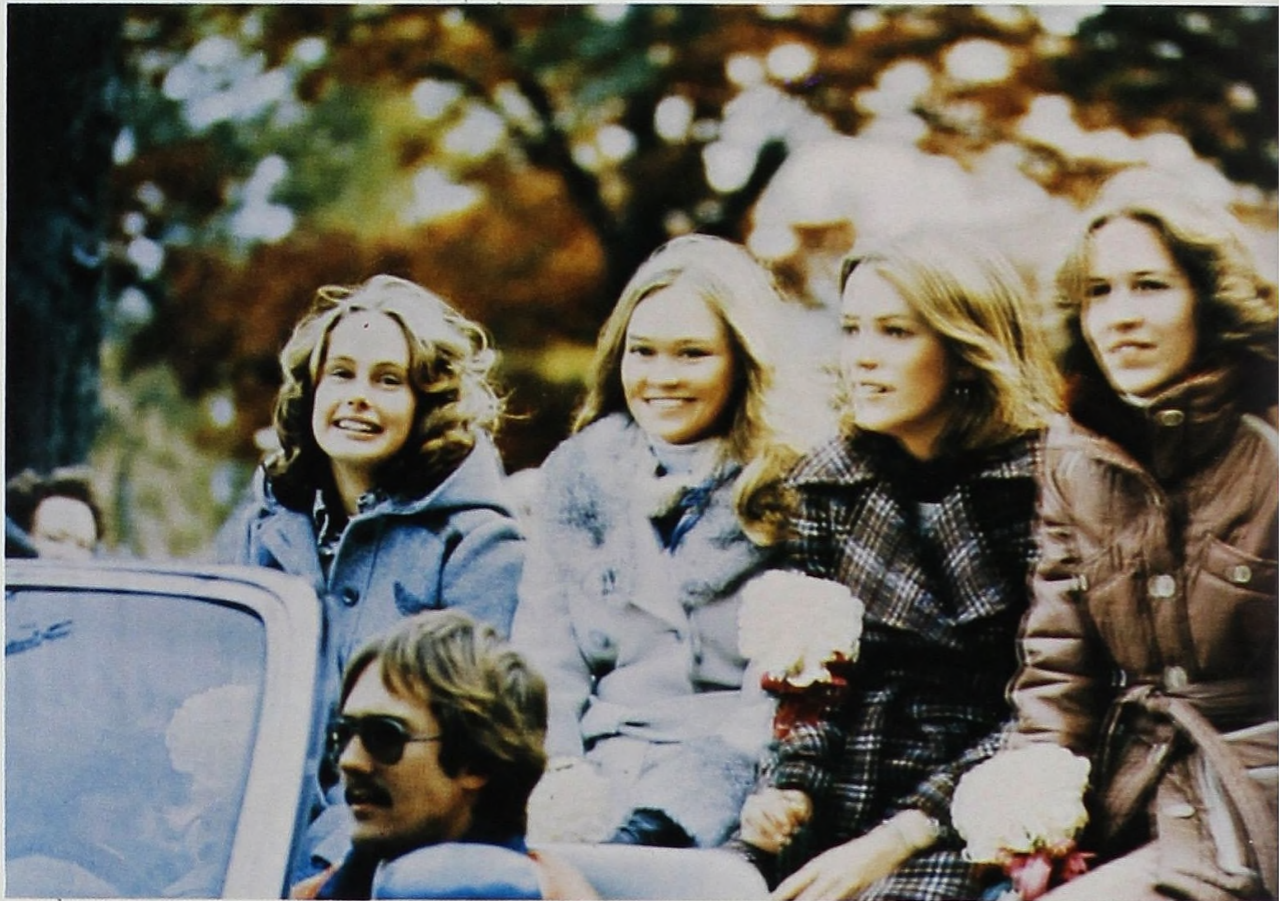




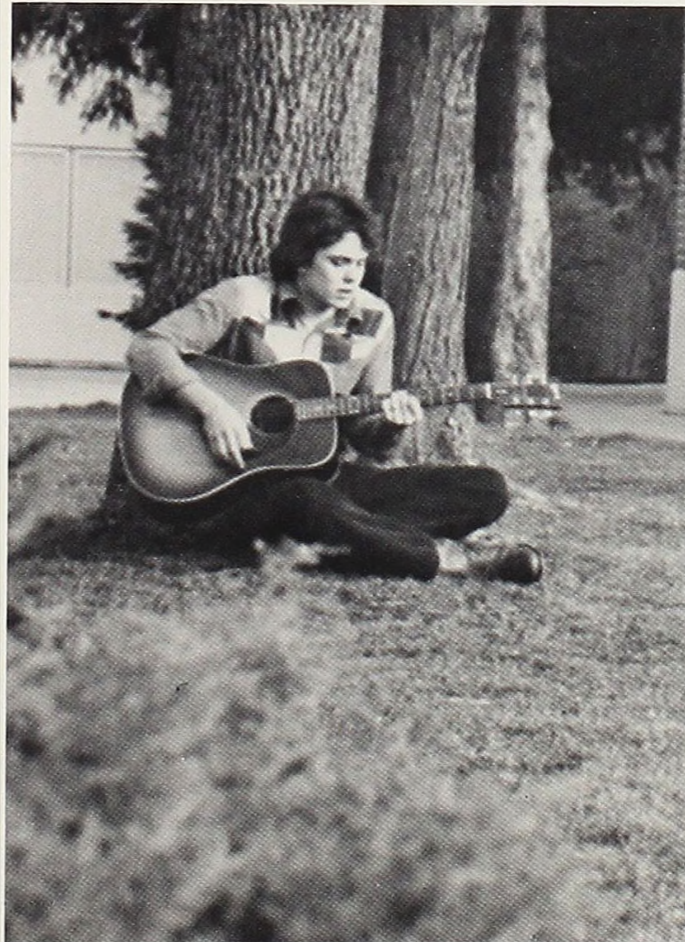

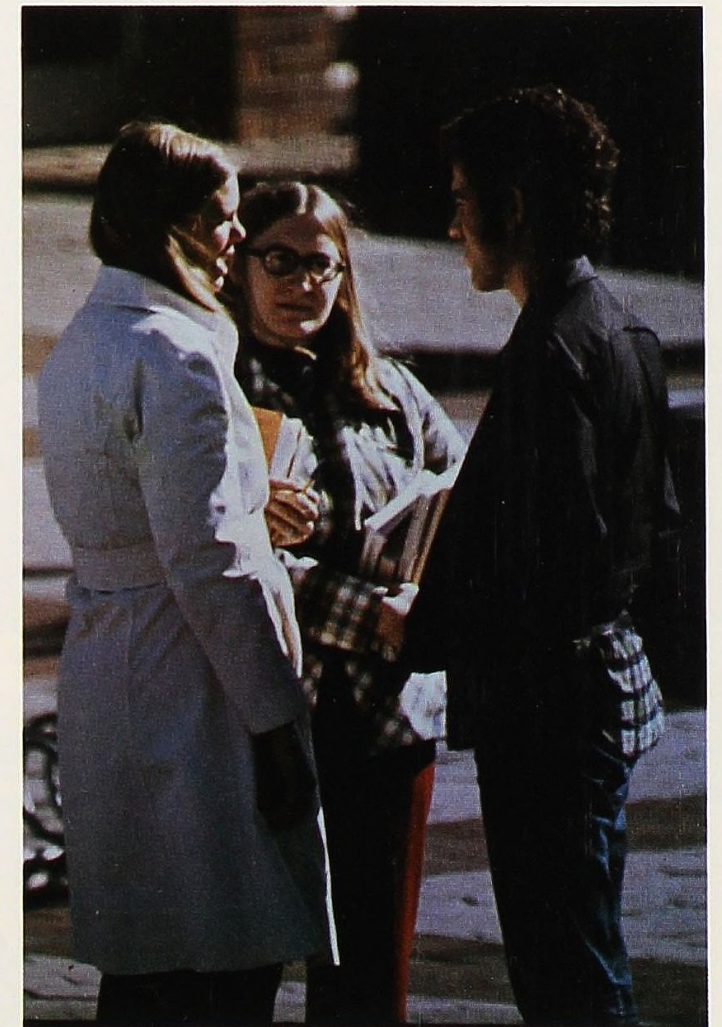
Initiative combined with keen human senses creates the opportunity for reaching out. By reaching out to others and going beyond ourselves, life is made more complete, more meaningful.

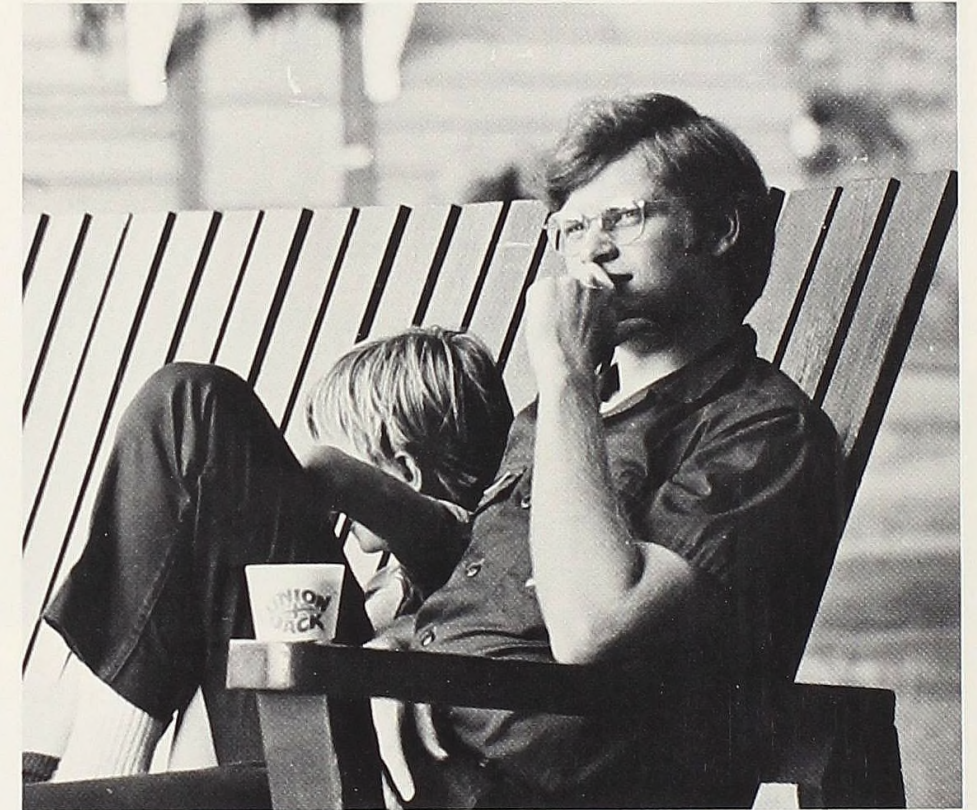
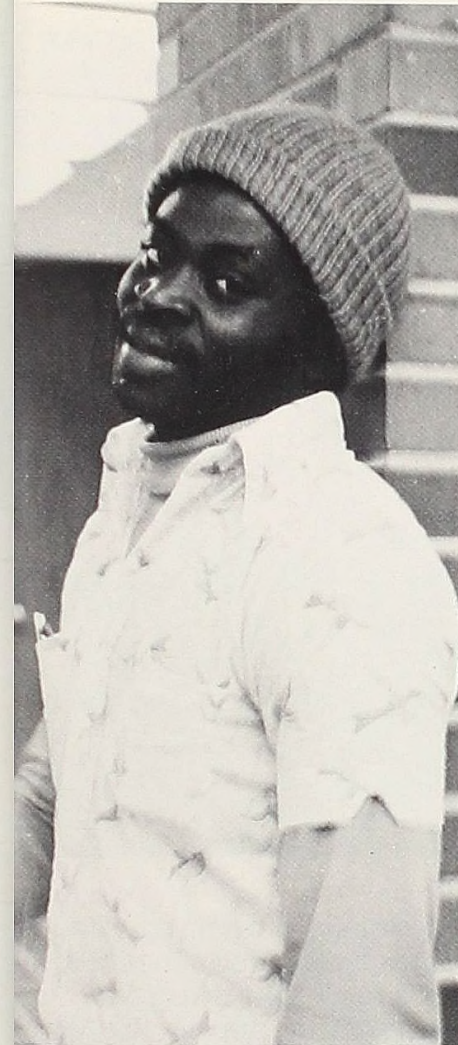
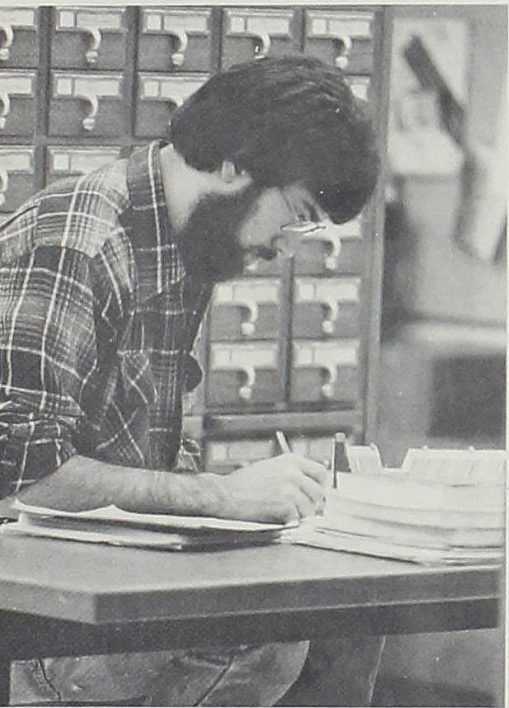

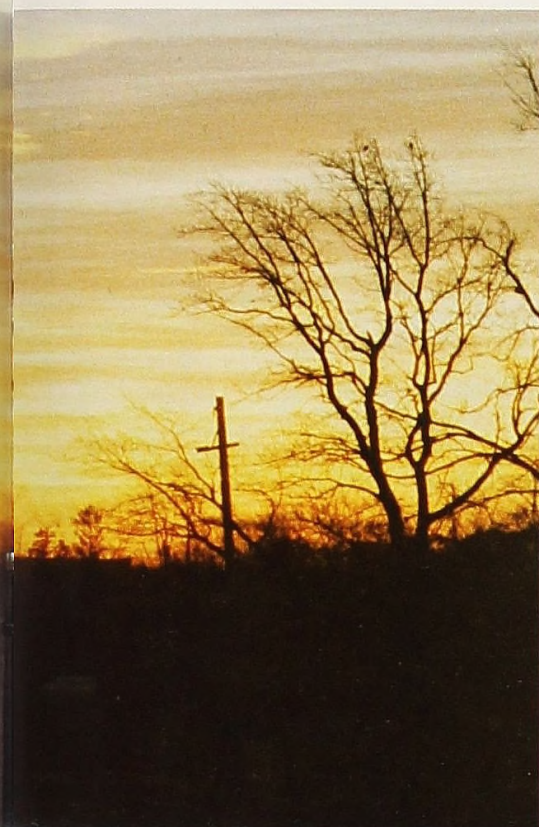


Reaching out is not only physical, indeed; it must also include the mental dimension. Through our awareness and confrontations with others we discover more about them and more about ourselves as well.





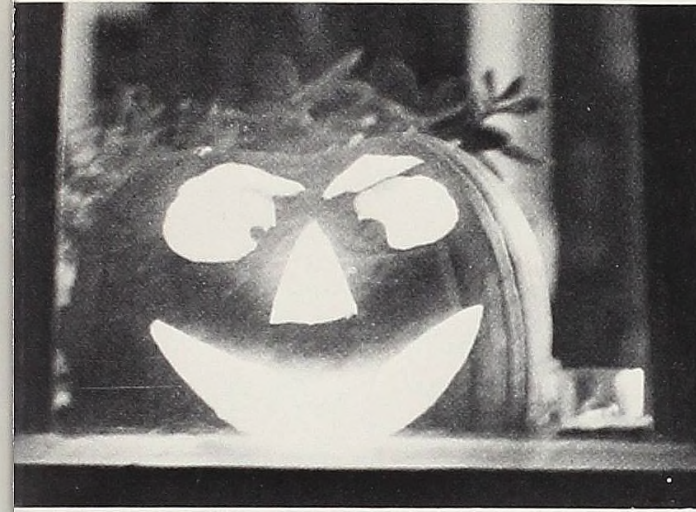
We must continually search for a deeper understanding of ideas and opinions put forth by our fellow man.



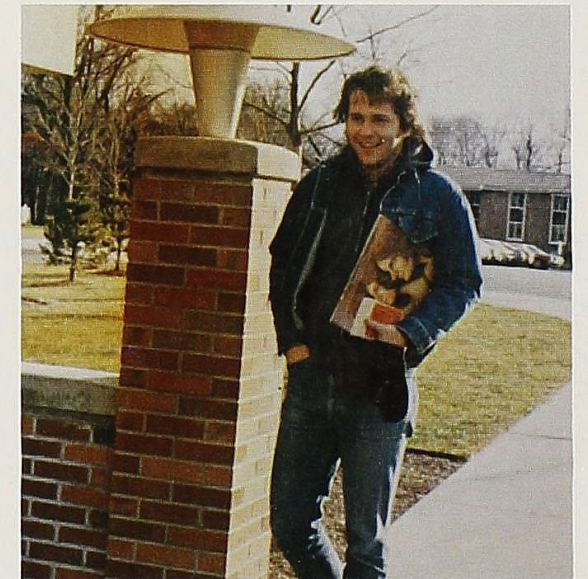

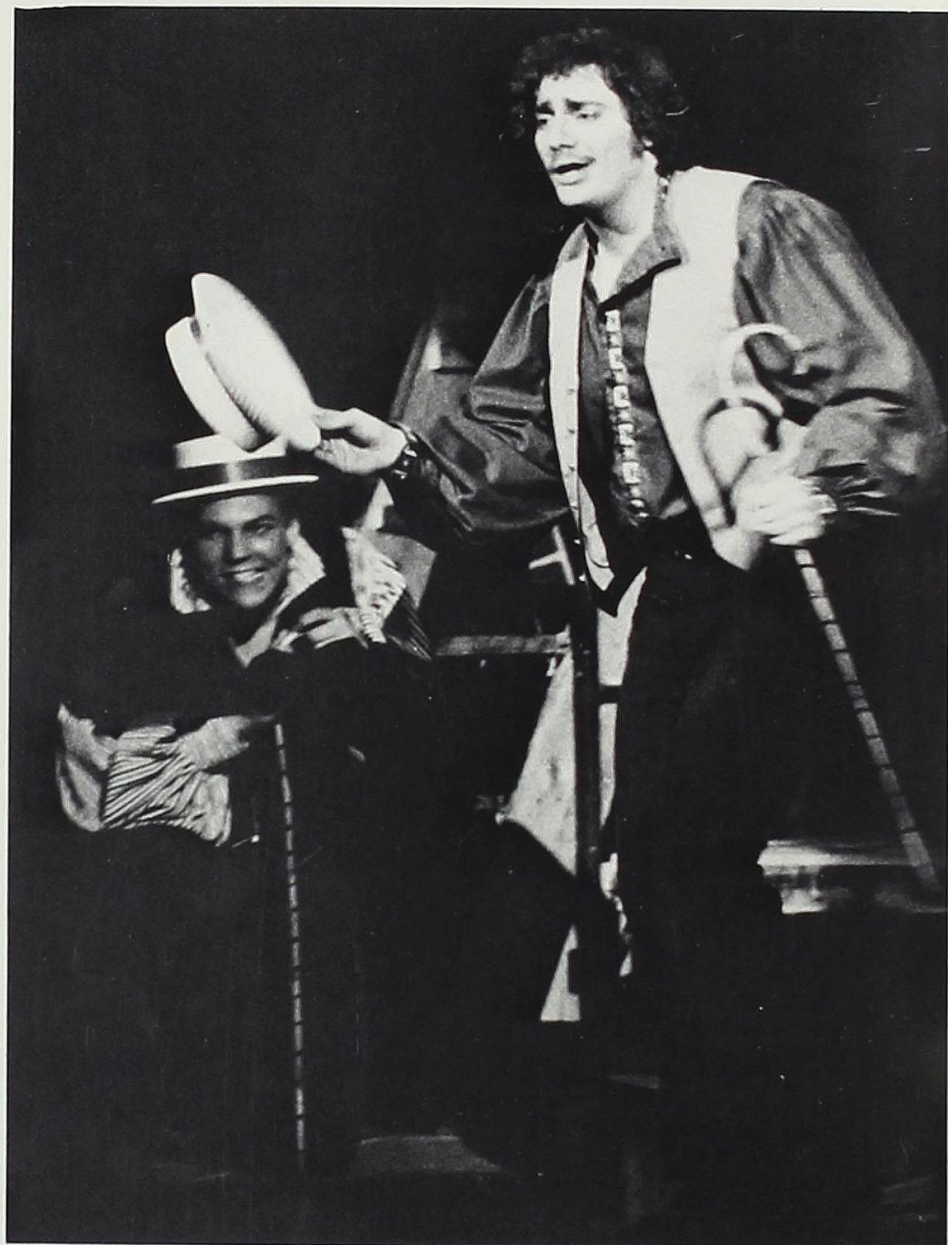
Perhaps this personal sharing may be considered giving too much of ourselves and if so, let it be. The personal benefits gained from reaching out to others is priceless.

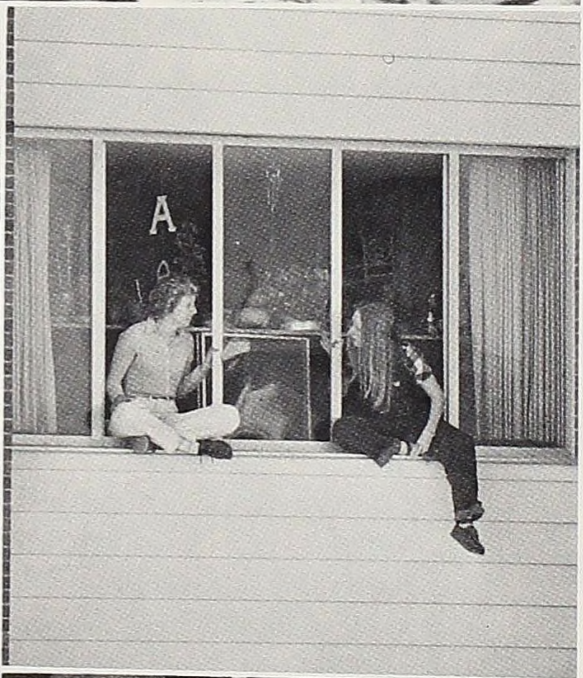


Knowledge, friendship, fun and memories are just a few of the products reaped. By going beyond ourselves to the population at large, a touch of humanness is added to our very being.

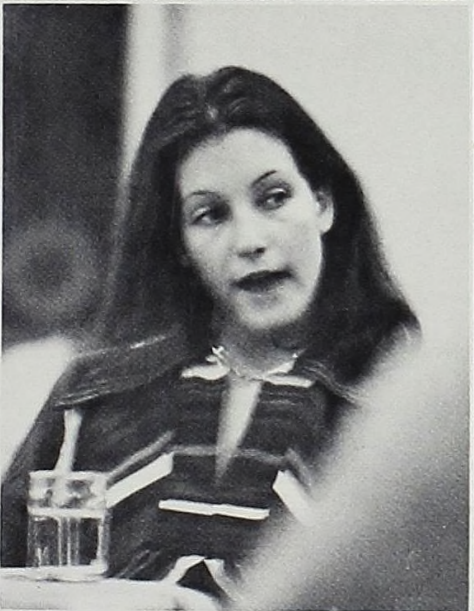

The final win-loss columns were not reflective of the total team effort put forth. Despite player improvement as the season progressed, the season record totalled a dismal 2-2-5.



Football

The Alma Scots finished their 1975 season with a 6-3 overall record, their best in 2 years. The Scots pulled into a close second place behind Hope in the MIAA League, with a 3-2 record. The Tri-Captains of the Scots were Bill Biebuyck, Leo Farhat, and Marv McKay who, along with their teammates generated a strong and spirited 1975 team. Best in-

dividual performances were taken by Bob Hamilton — Scot running back, who broke three Alma rushing records, and took over 1st position in the MIAA for Rushing. Jim Meyers booted the longest field-goal for Alma in the '75 season with a 46 yard goal. And Tim Jank, a sophomore tackle, was awarded the Most Valuable Player of the team. This year the whole Scot team pulled together to create a very good season, way to go baby! Do it again!

The Women's Tennis team ended their 1976 season with a 4-2 mark. The team pulled into third place in the League meet this year.

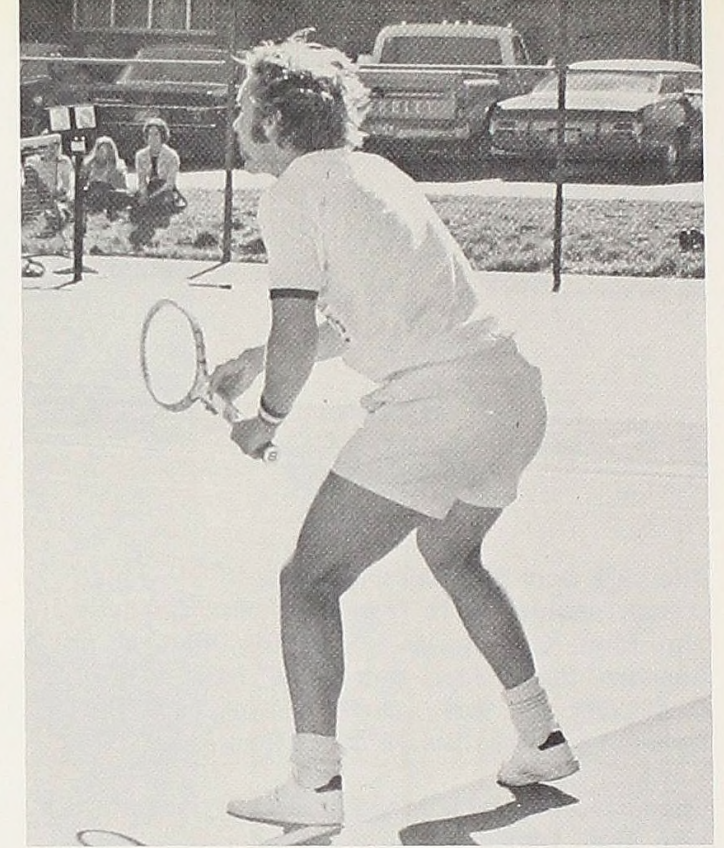
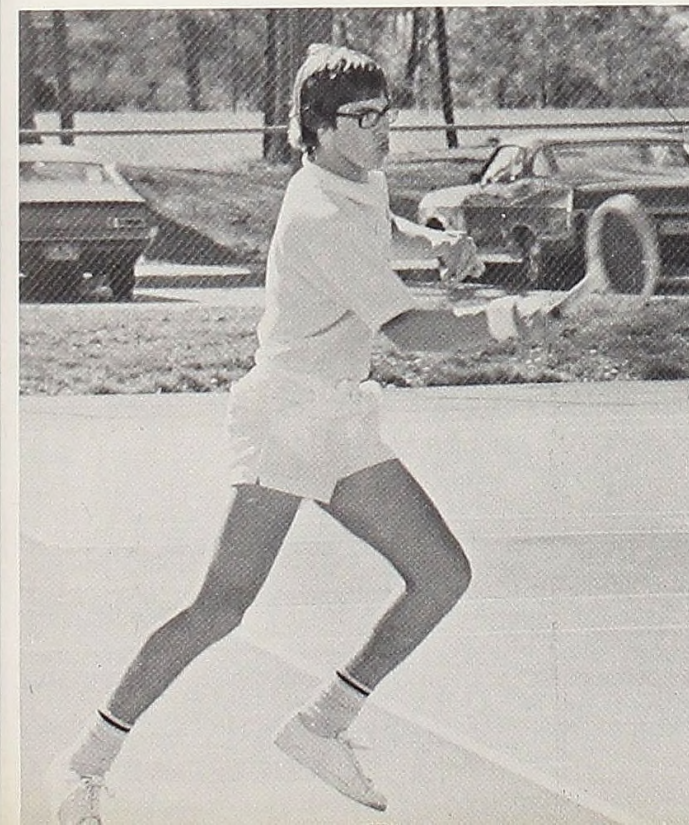

The Scots captured a second place in the MIAA with an 8-4 record.

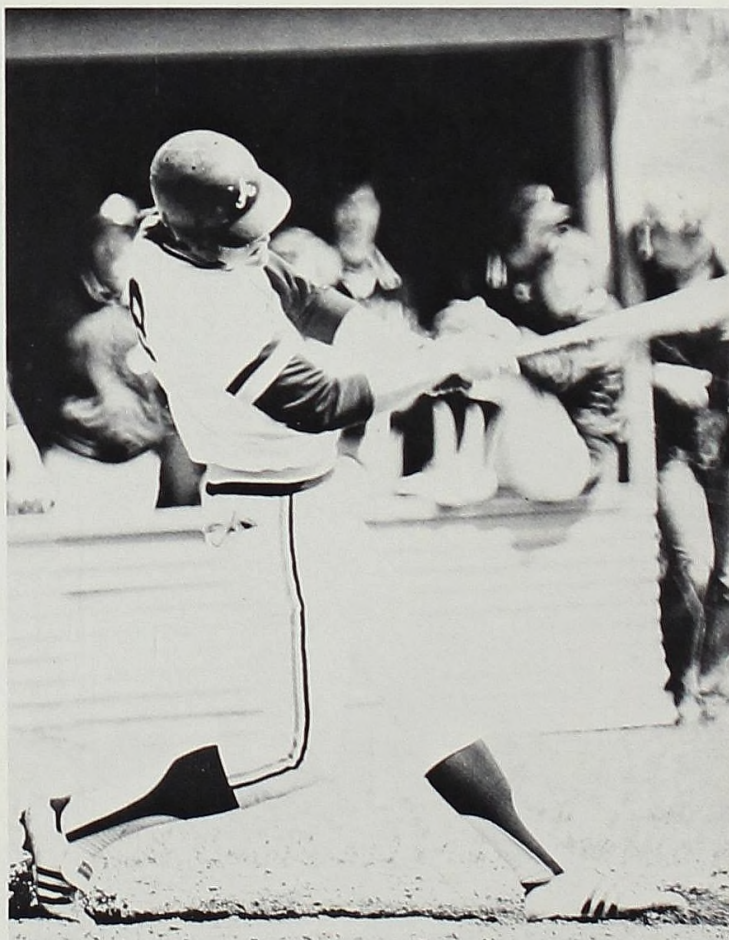

Founded in the fall of 1922 by students, this unique group has undergone an extensive metamorphosis from its original pep band status to a concert ensemble with a national reputation. 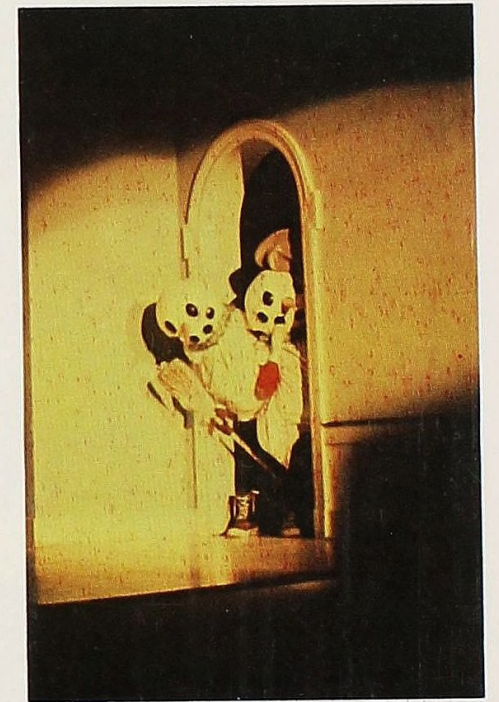


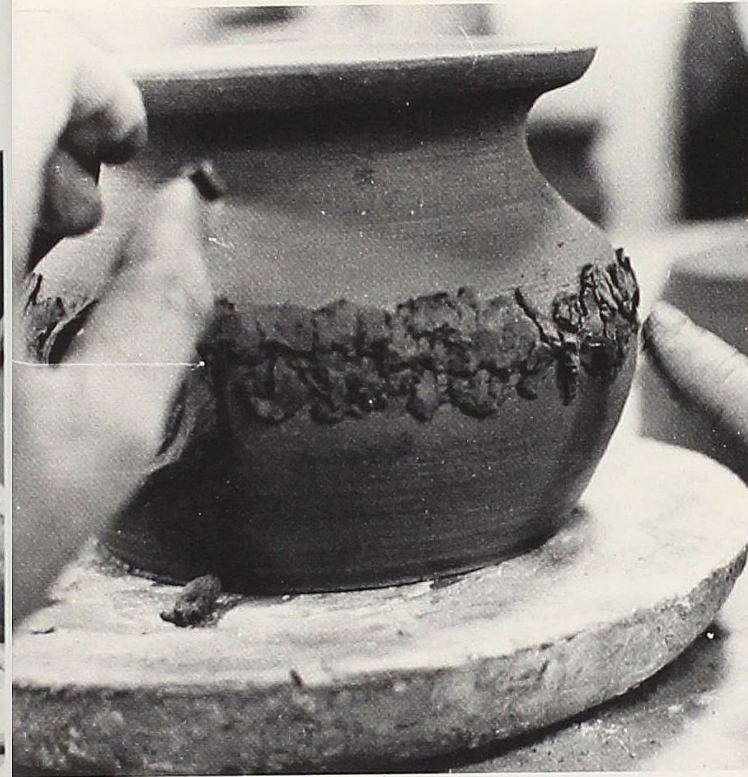
In fact, we are just a sampling of those unique bodies, for we too come from numerous elements of life.



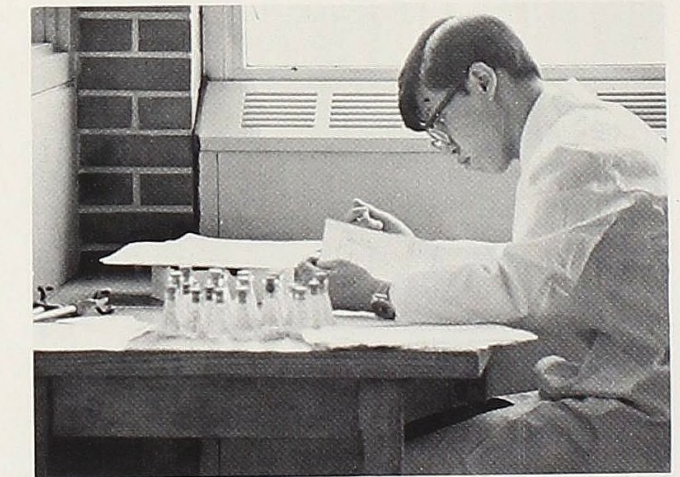
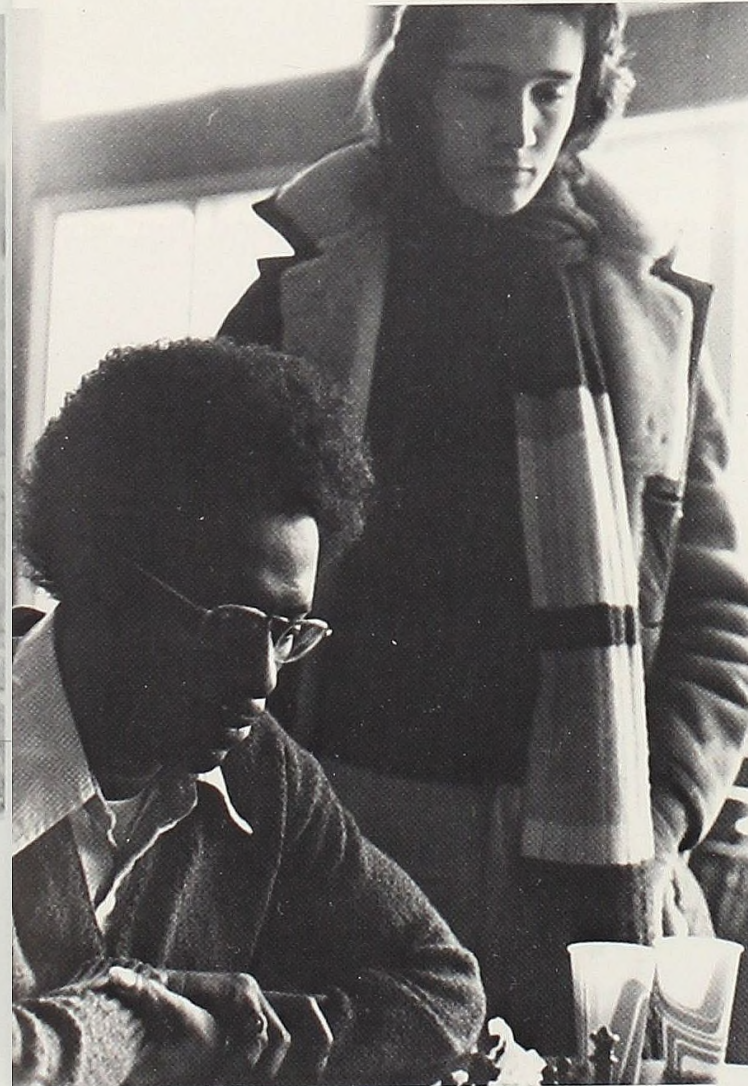
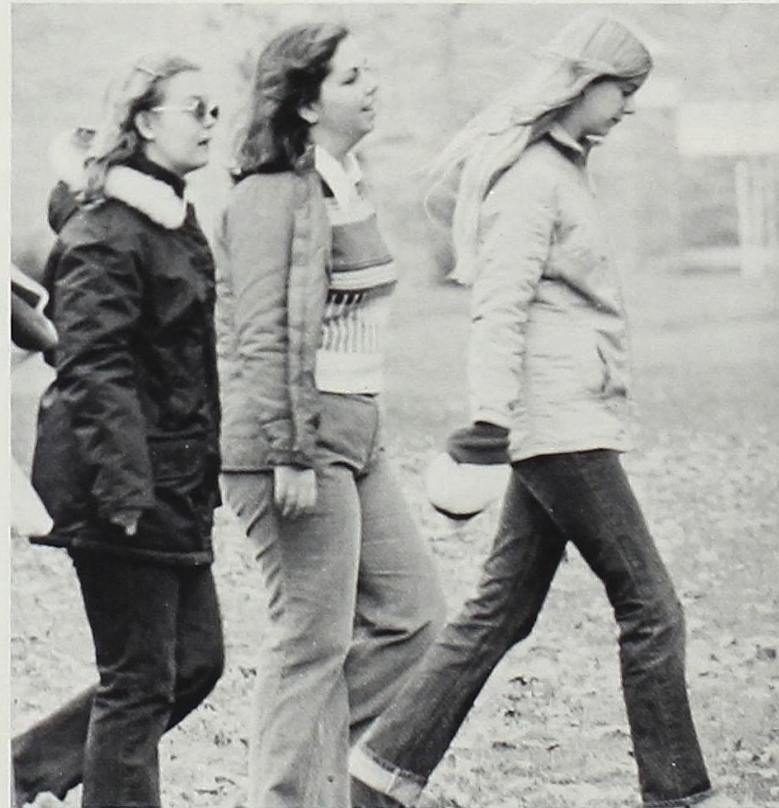


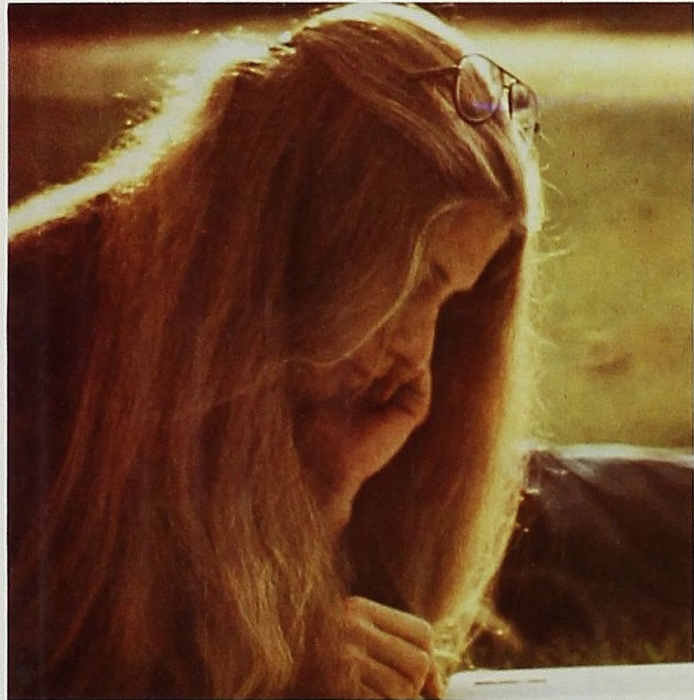

Through social and academic interaction we share and reach out to each other. Offered in this one place is an atmosphere conducive to both work and fun which fosters such interaction.

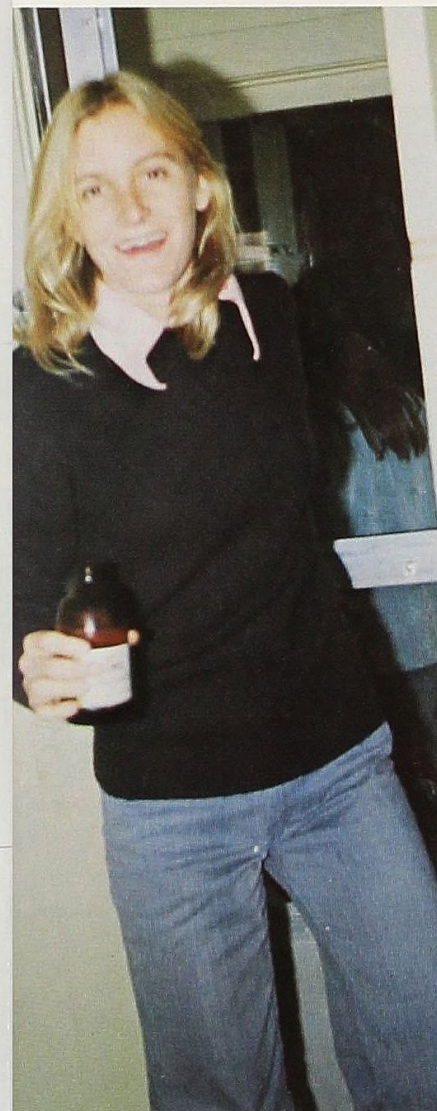


So, as we leave Alma College, we take with us not only knowledge and memories, for new knowledge becomes obsolete with time and memories offer little for the future.



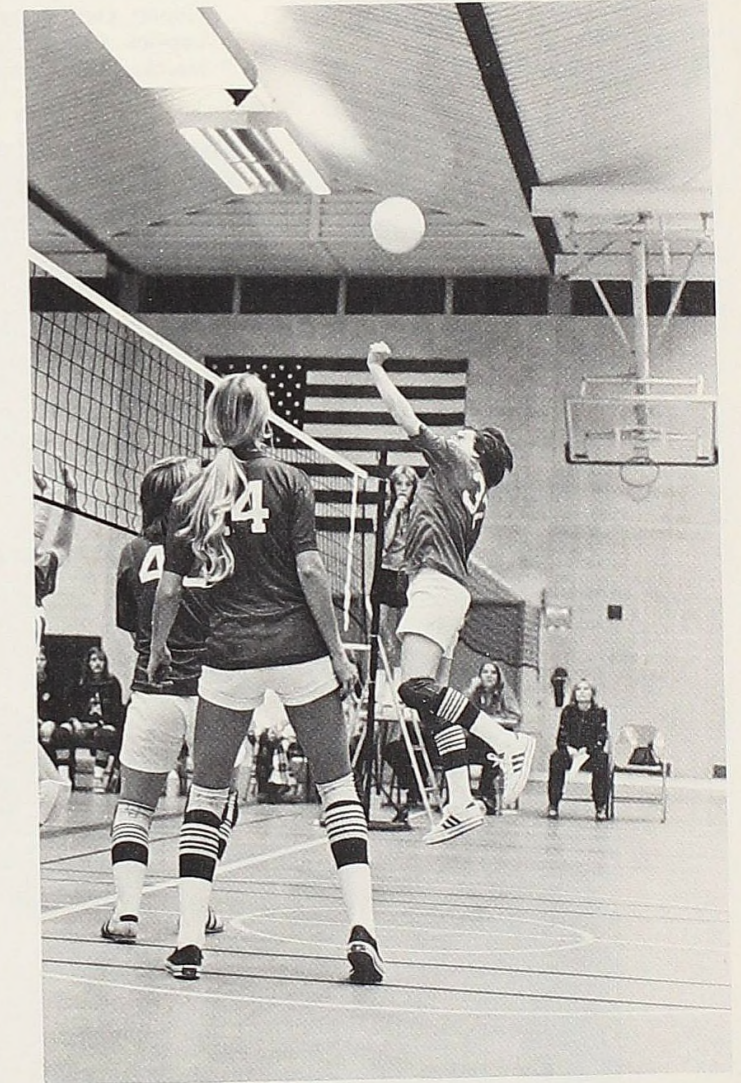


In addition to memories and knowledge we take with us a lasting quality for sharing ourselves and enjoying others; the quality of being able to reach out.
