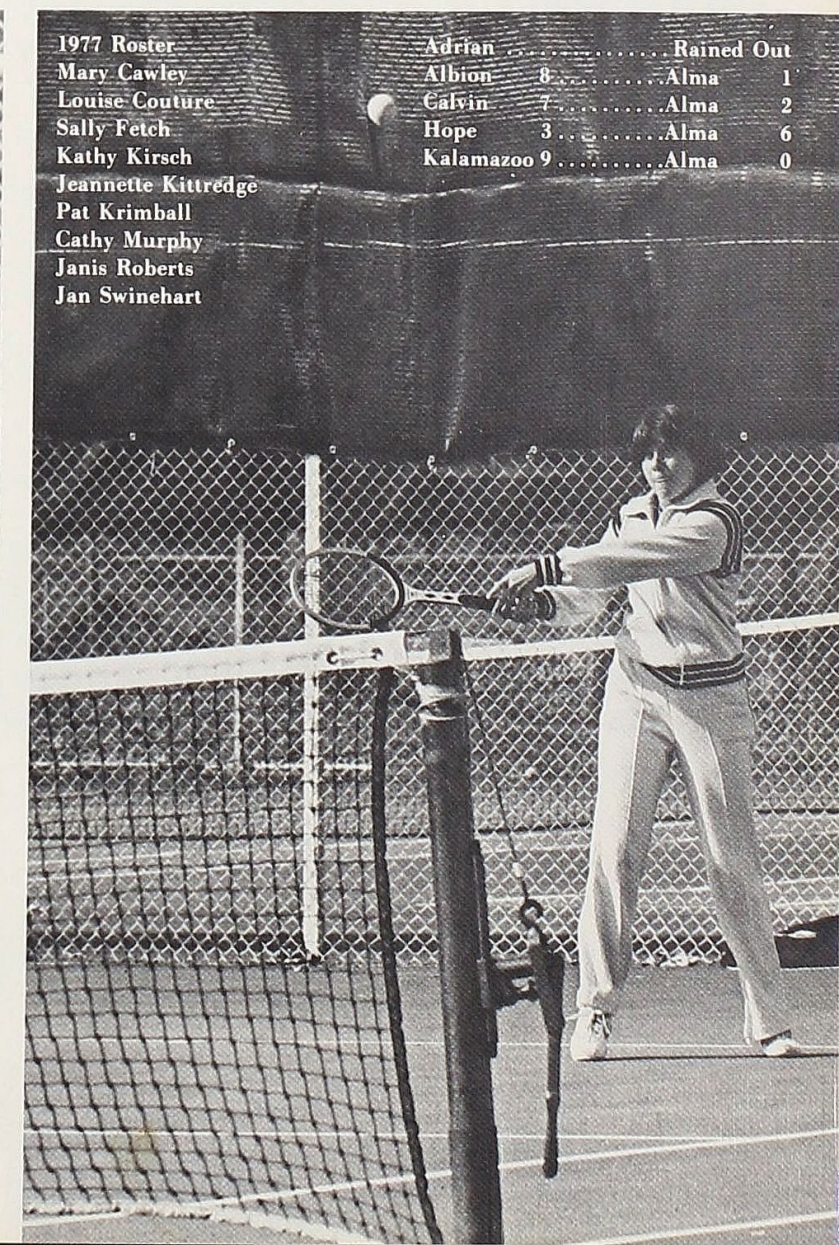
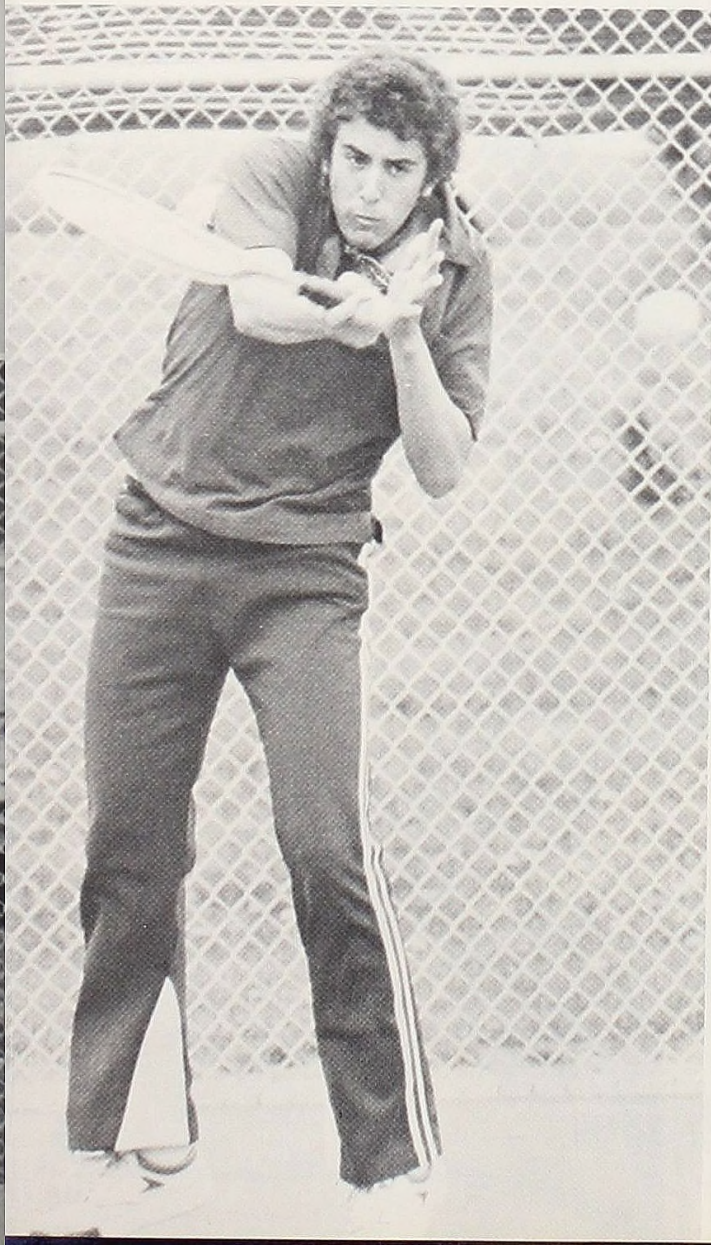
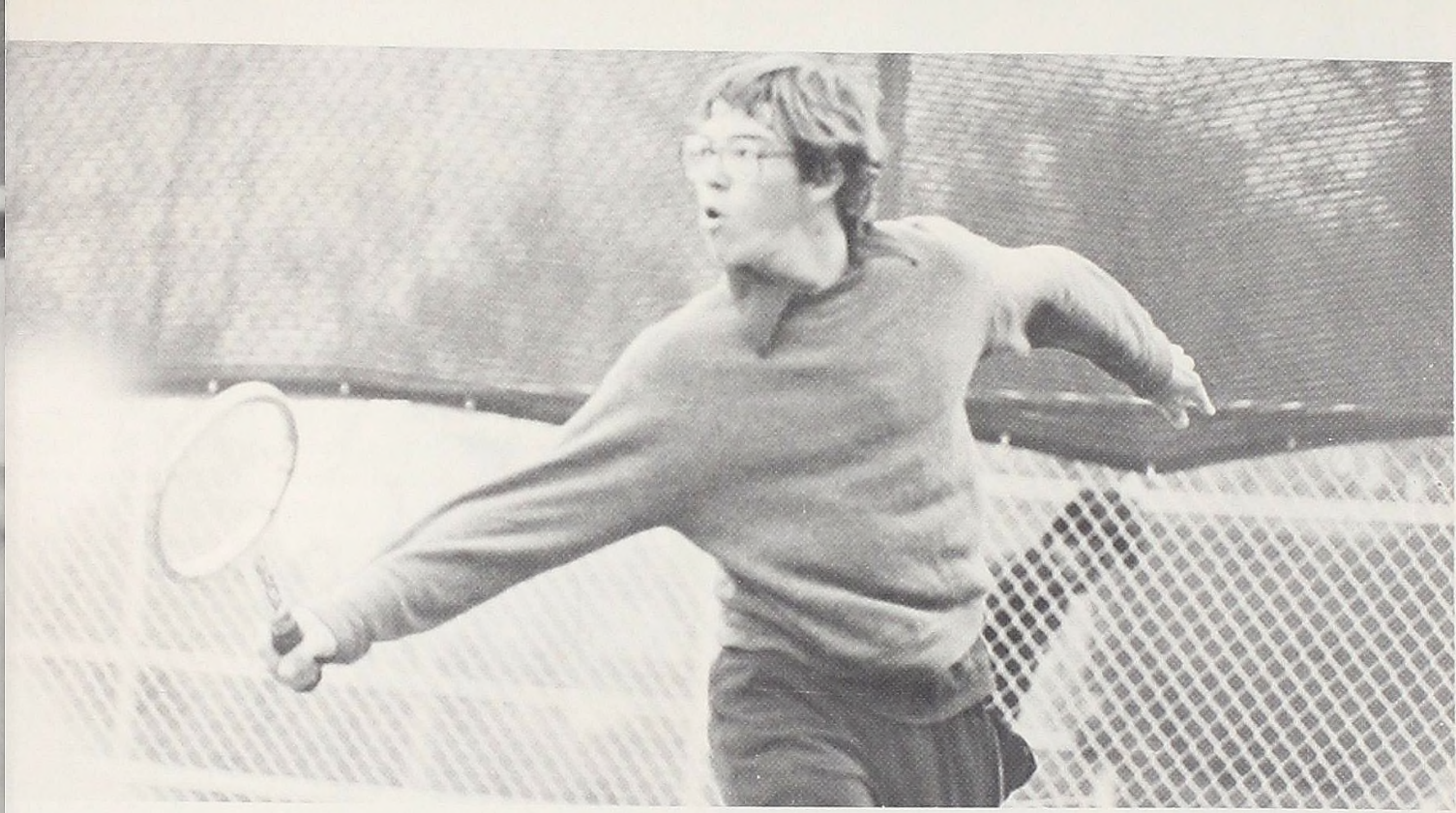
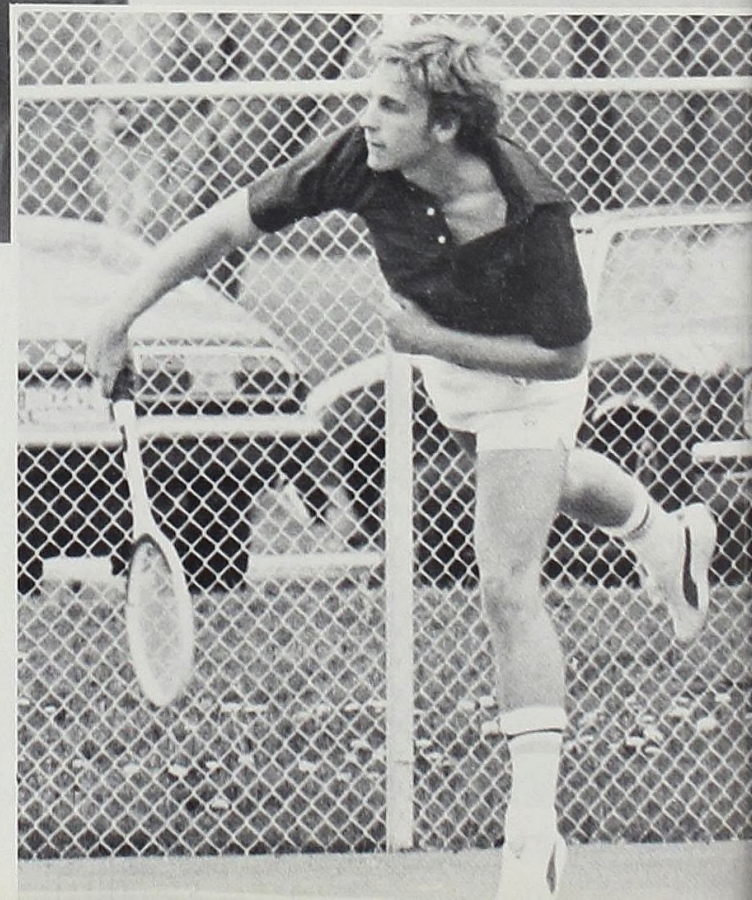
The 1977 Scot Baseball team finished the year with an overall record of 14 wins and 16 losses. This years captains were Ed Solack and Gary Kondratek.

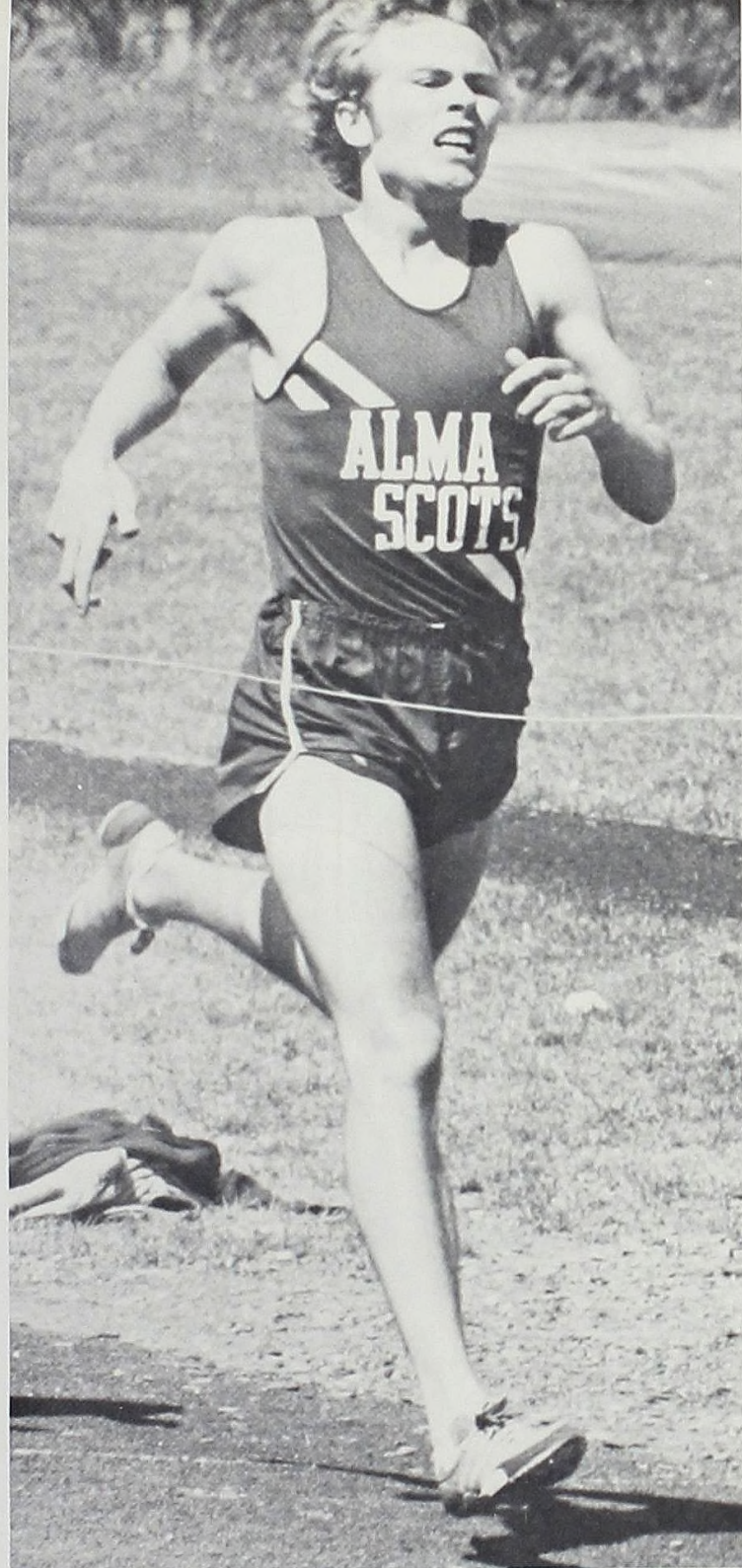

Special honors in the NAIA Championship went to Bob Connors, Don Groves, and Tim Tilma.

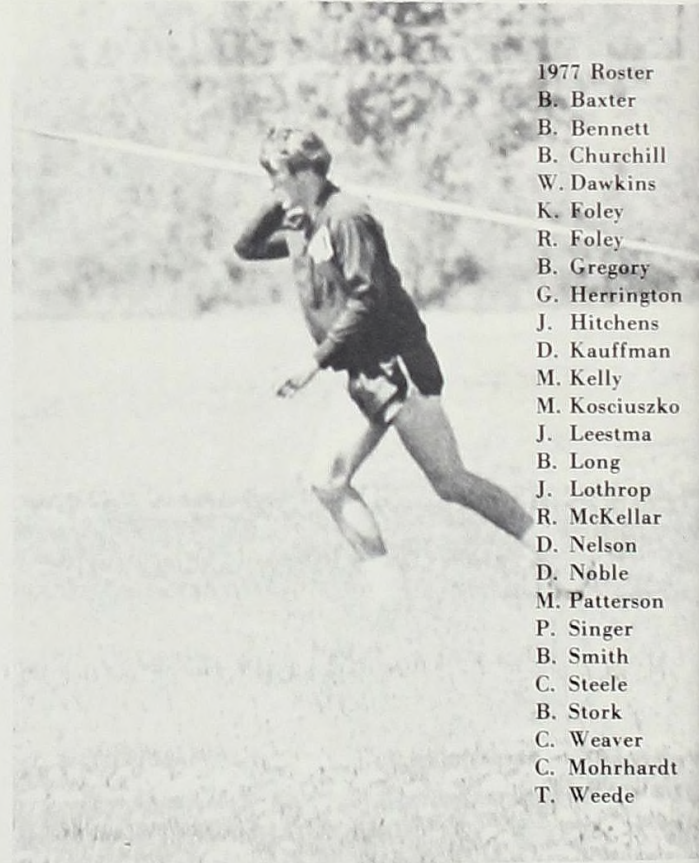

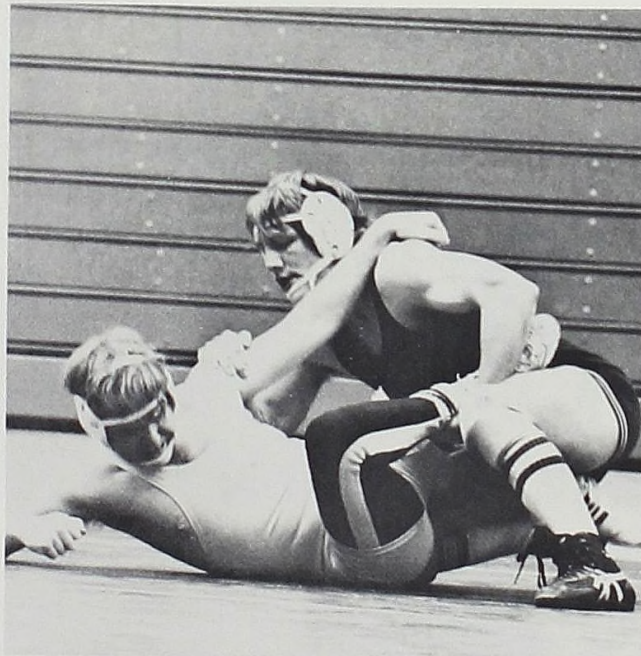


Women's Track

The women's track team ran this year on a club basis in hopes of building a strong nucleus for next year. In spite of the small number participating, the team was very competitive within the league.

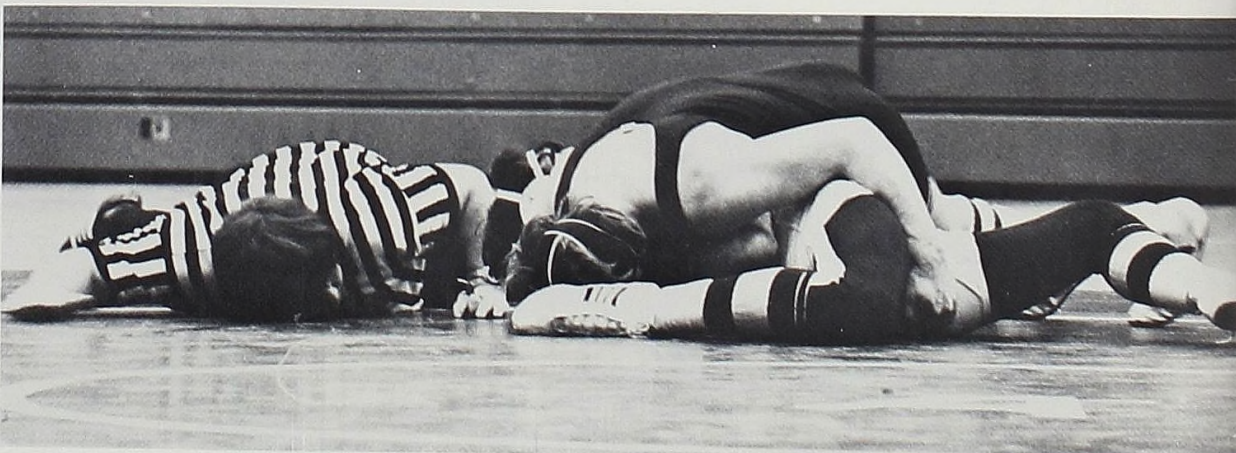

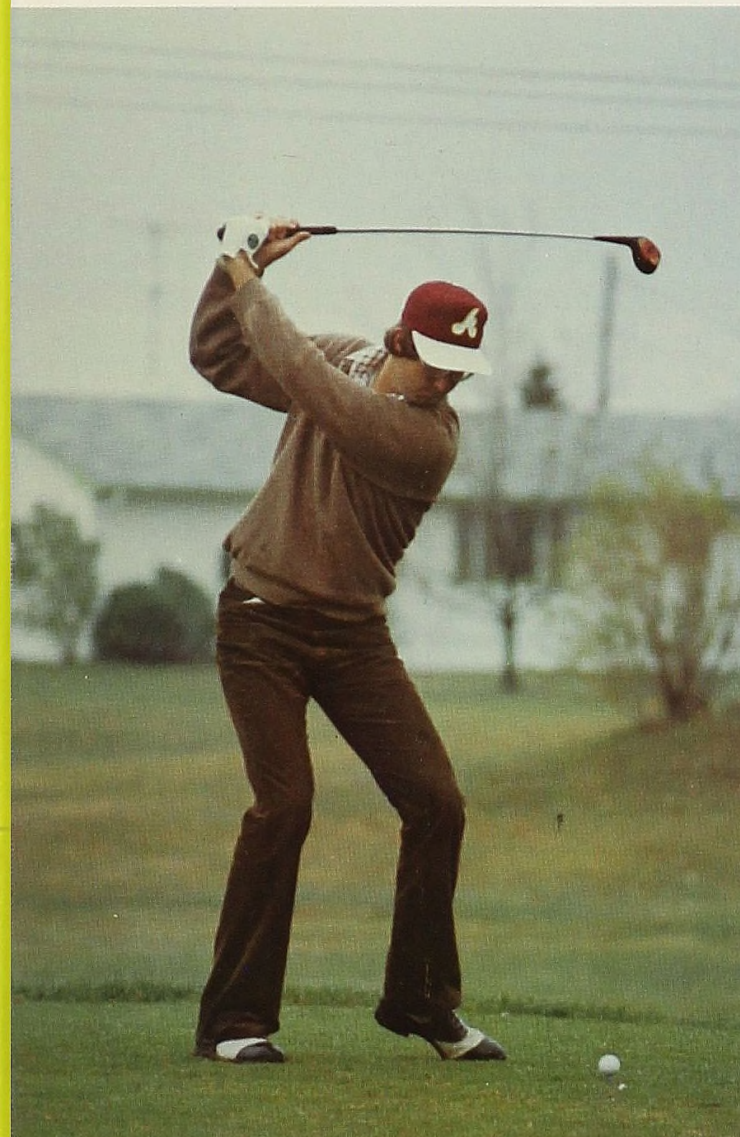
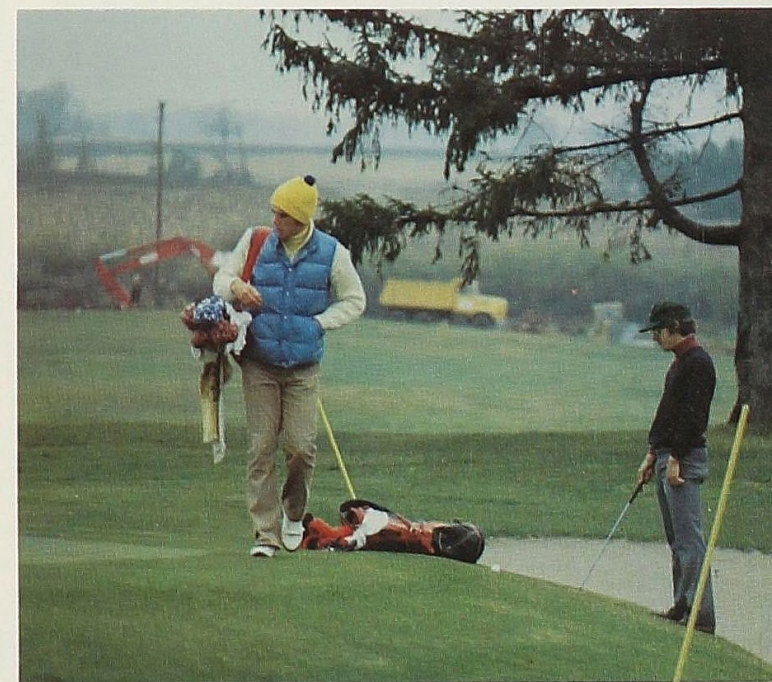
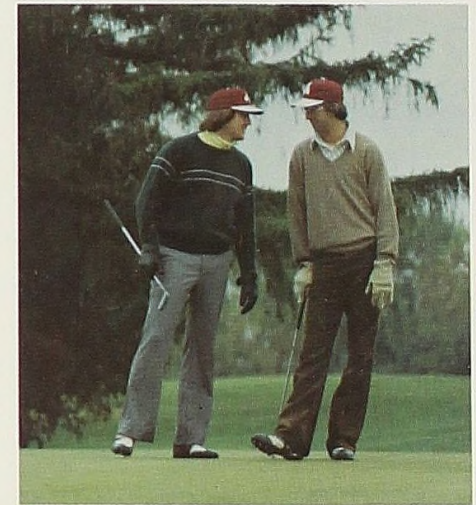


GOLF

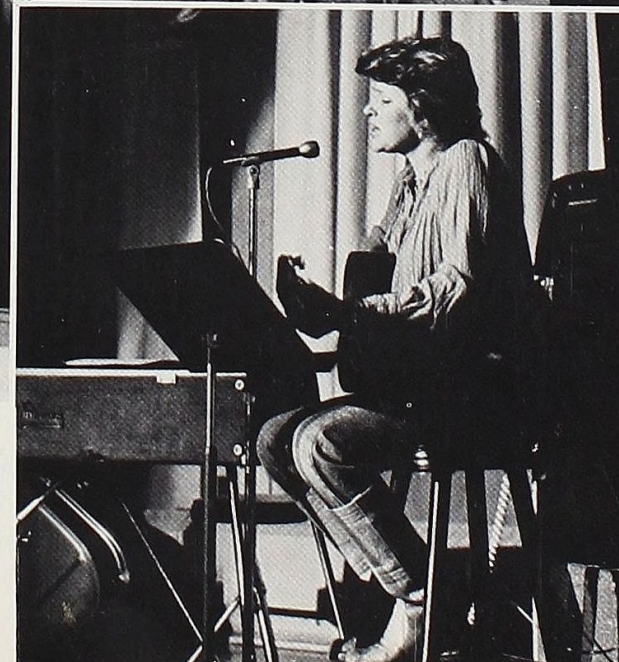
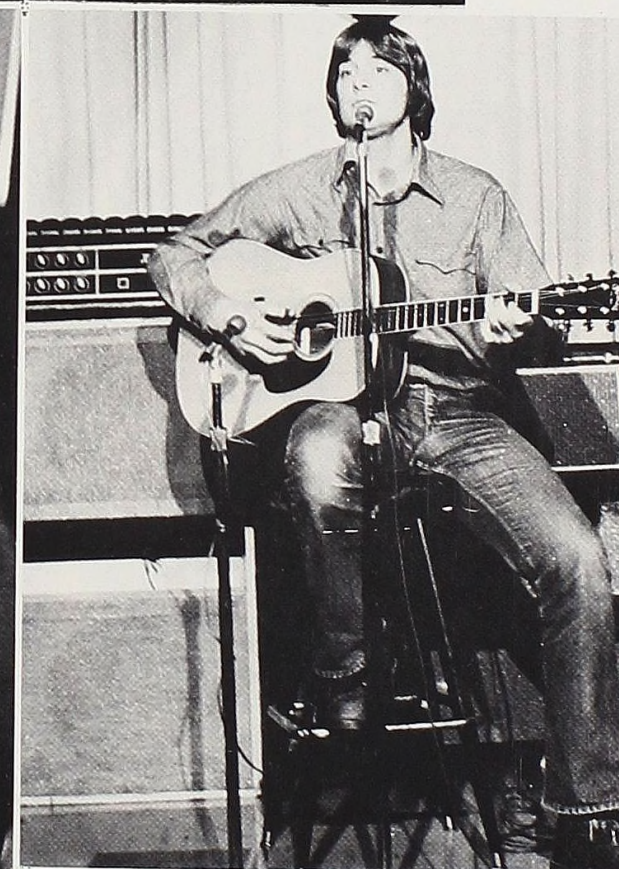


Public Policy Debate
