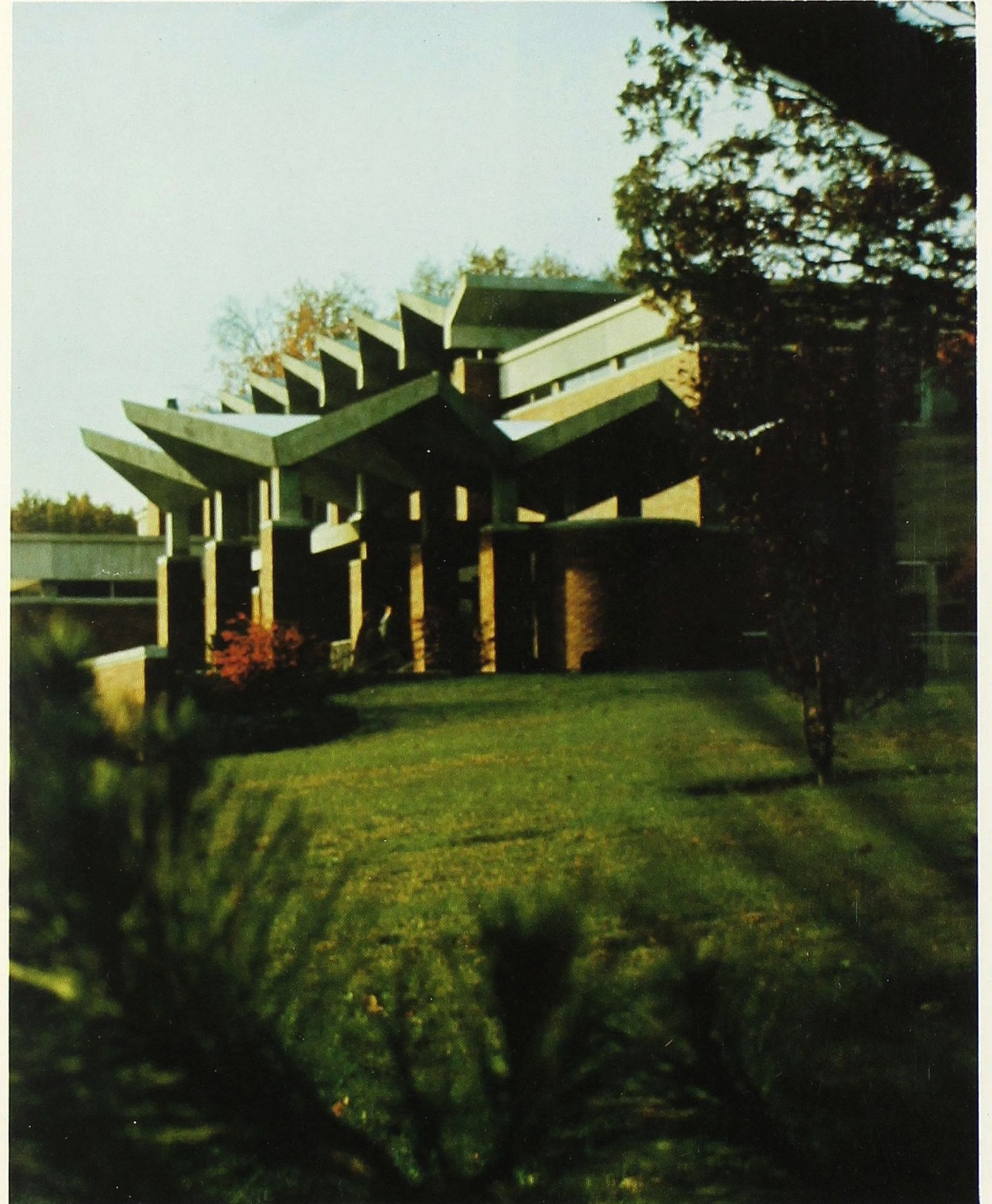

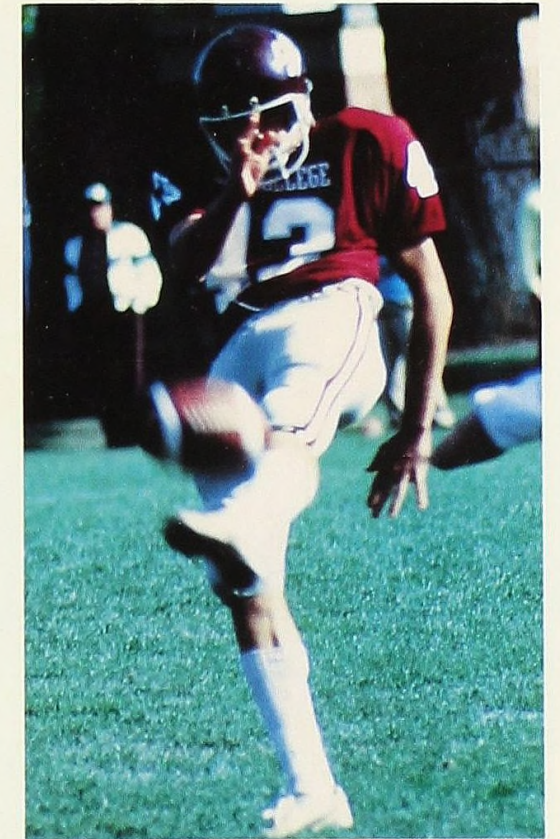
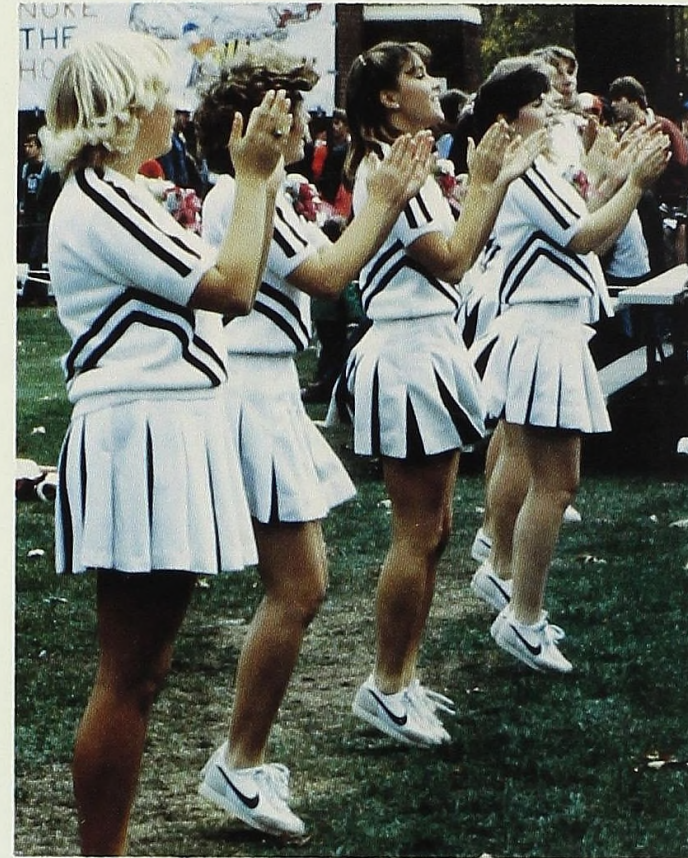

Phebe, a shepherdess, spurns the love of a shepherd, Silvius, but herself falls in love with Ganymede. Touchstone meets a peasant girl, Audrey...All these love entanglements are put aright and all couples are united in a final marriage celebration just as Duke Frederick is converted and restores his brother to his rightful position.

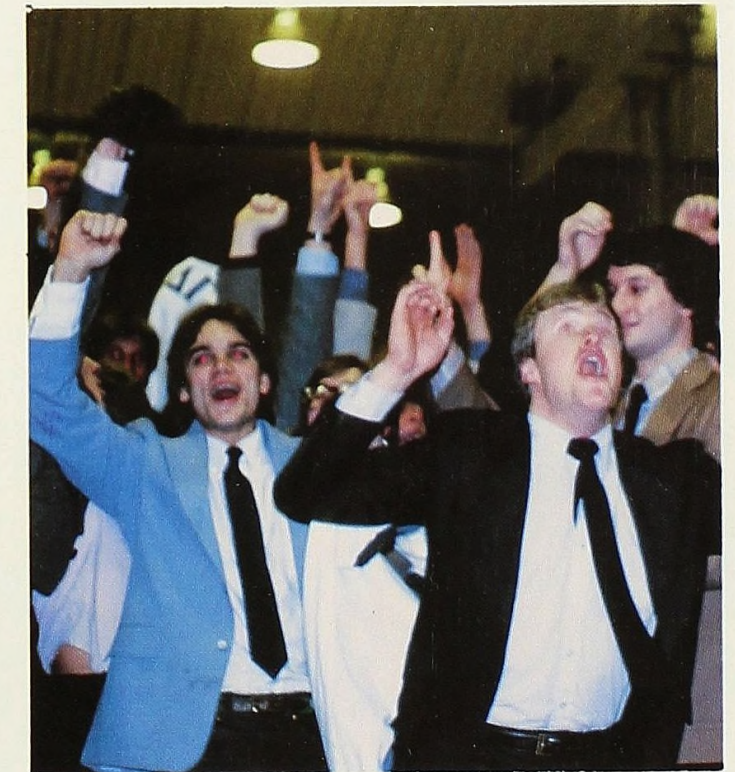

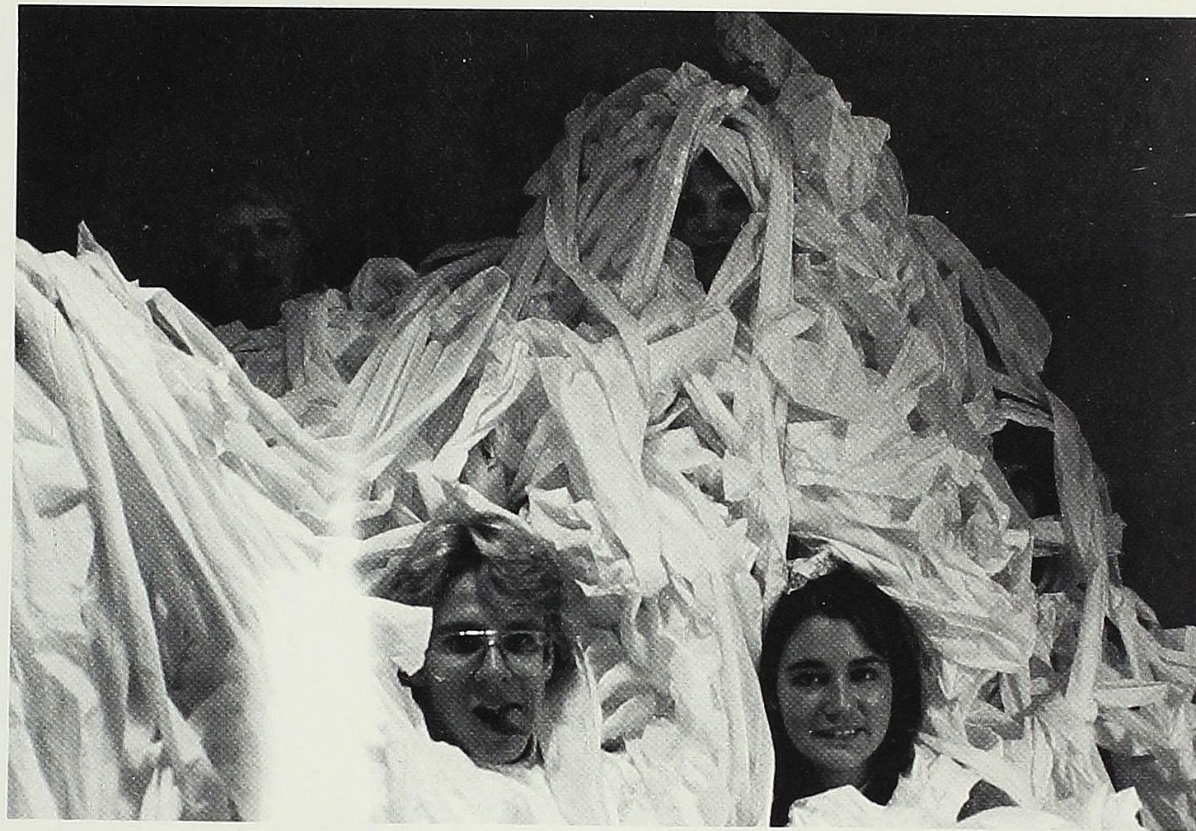


1983 Runouts and Bids Day

The Alma College Football team tied for sixth in the MIAA Football League in 1982 with many major achievements. Alma College players Phil Annese and Mark Konecny were ranked nationally in the NCAA Division III statistics. Annese, a junior, was ranked first in punt returns and fourth in pass interceptions; while Konecny, a sophomore, was listed sixth in kickoff returns and eleventh in rushing.

Another major achievement was the selection of Konecny, junior Scott Vicari, senior Scott Cousineau, and junior Jeff Rowley to the All-MIAA First team for their accomplishments. Annese, senior Brian Murphy, junior Sean Burns, and senior Dave Gray received second team defense recognition, while senior George Gulliver was Alma's only second offensive second team member.

During the year, the Scots' offense gave an impressive first half but failed to keep their lead. Head Coach Phil Brooks stated, "We made a lot of strides from where we were a year ago. The team as a whole improved this year although the record doesn't show it." Brooks added, "we had a better intensity and were more competitive."

After establishing a second place finish in the MIAA, the Alma Field Hockey players were honored with the selection of six of its members to the all-league team. Chosen for the first team as sweeper was senior Maxine Button and junior Shari Allen as goalie. Second team members were junior Lori Fedewa as forward and freshmen Lori Audrain as midfielder. Sophomore Stacey Emeott and senior Jane Adams were awarded honorable mentions as halfbacks.

Coach Peg Ciccolella credited Button as the most consistent player on the team. "It's hard for anyone to score on us," claims Ciccolella. "But the Allen/Button combination on defense allows us to take a great deal of risks offensively."

Those offensive risks allowed Fedewa to share the league high scoring honors with 13 goals. "Lori Audrain and I really work well together," explained Fedewa. She can bring the ball down the field well; I just stay with her into the circle, then we penetrate towards the goal."

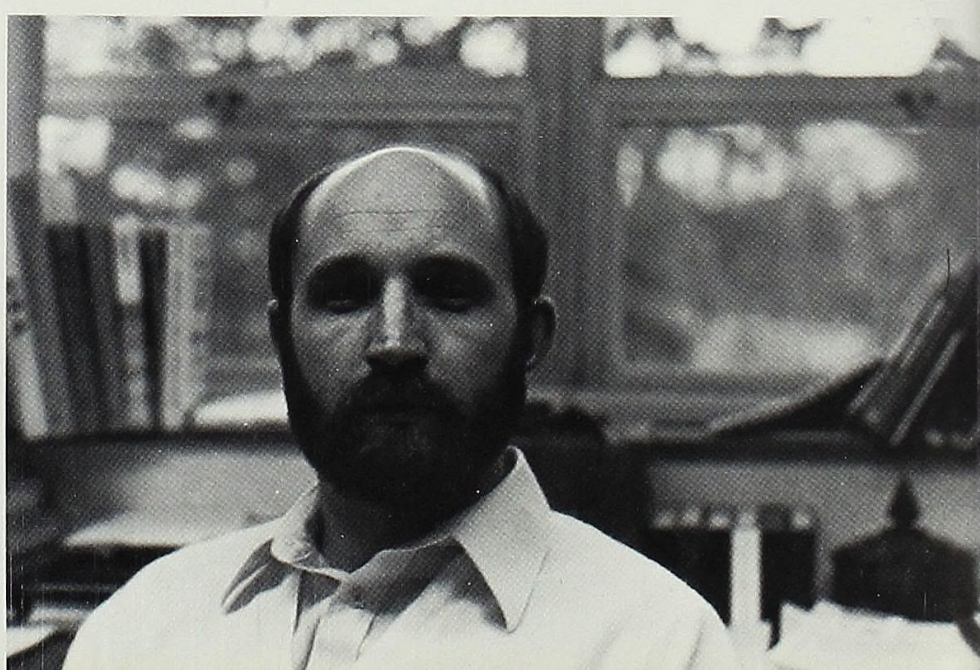
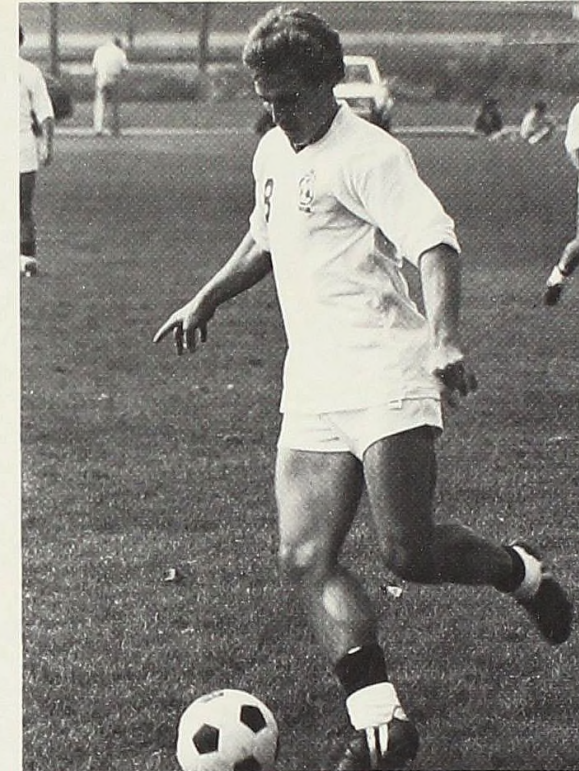

Soccer

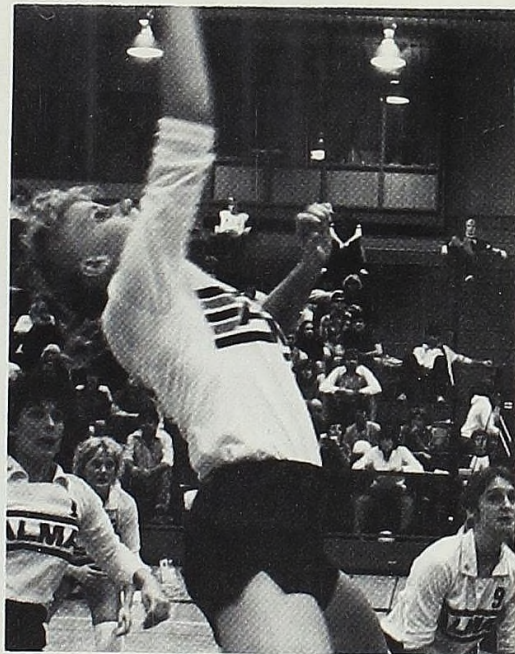
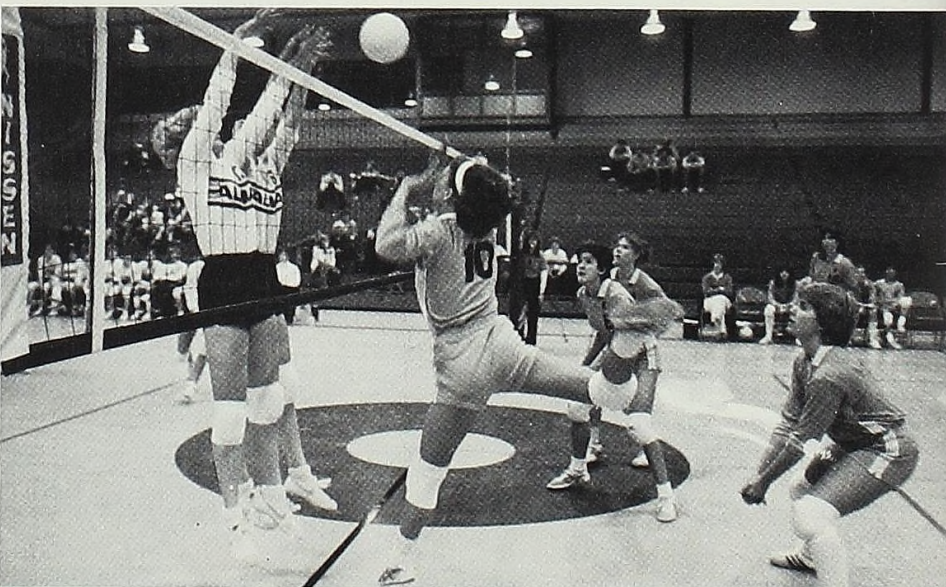
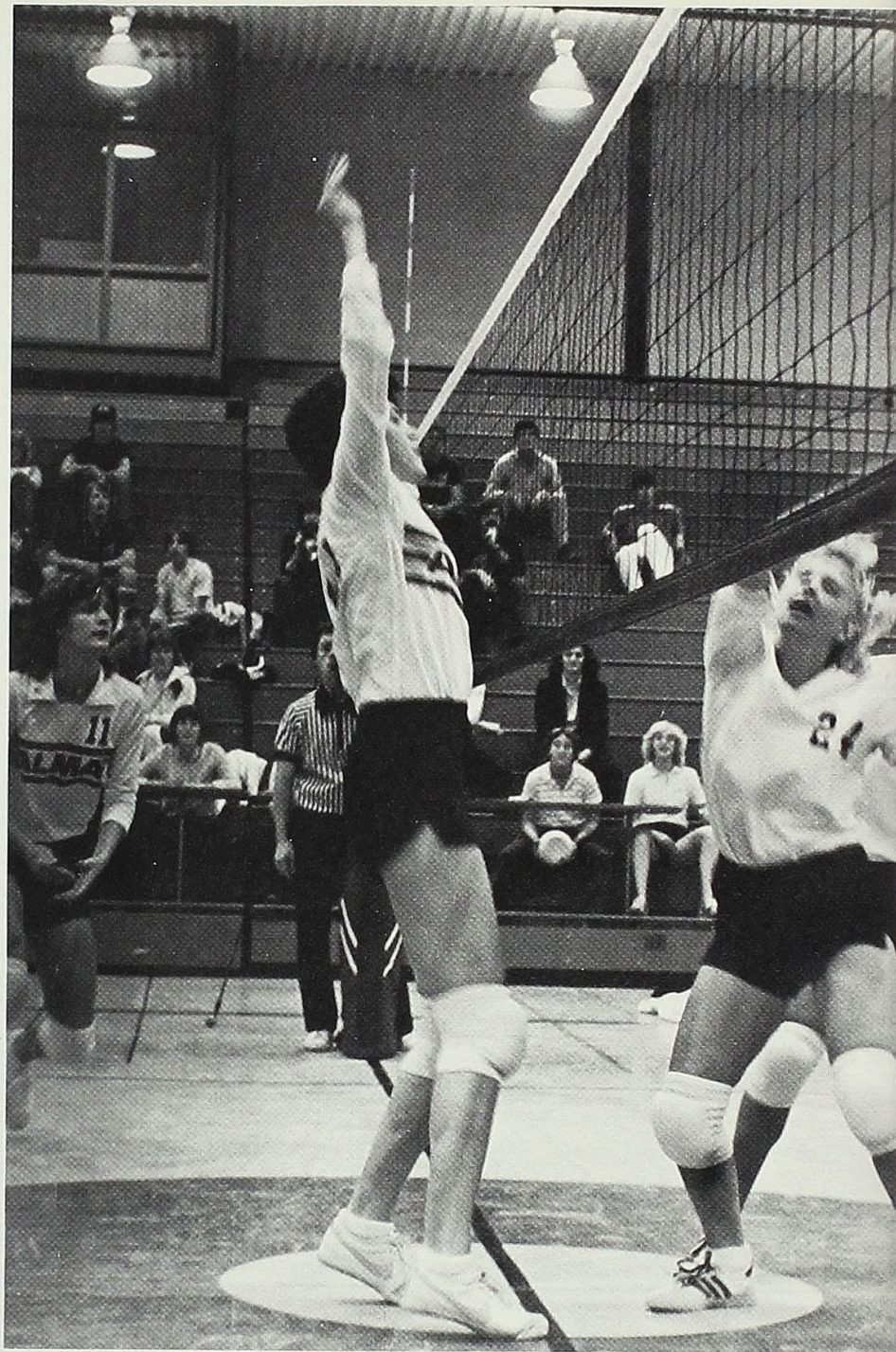

MIAA champs and we wanted to reach that goal."

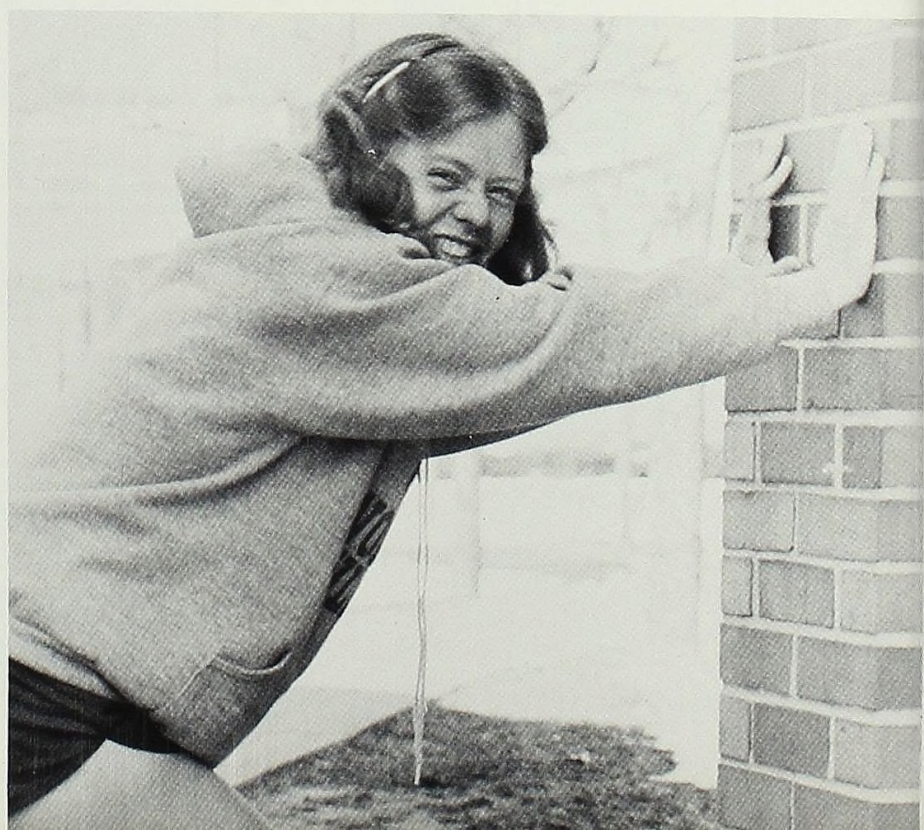

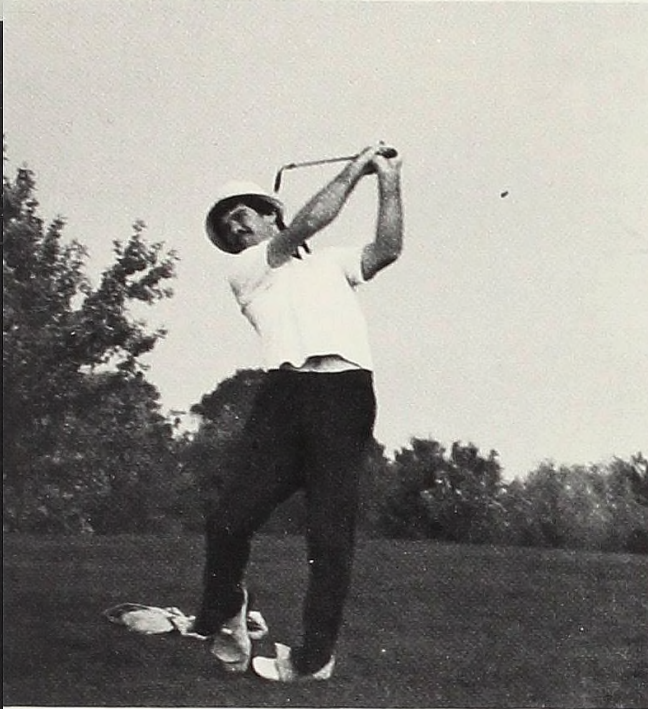


Cross Country On The Run

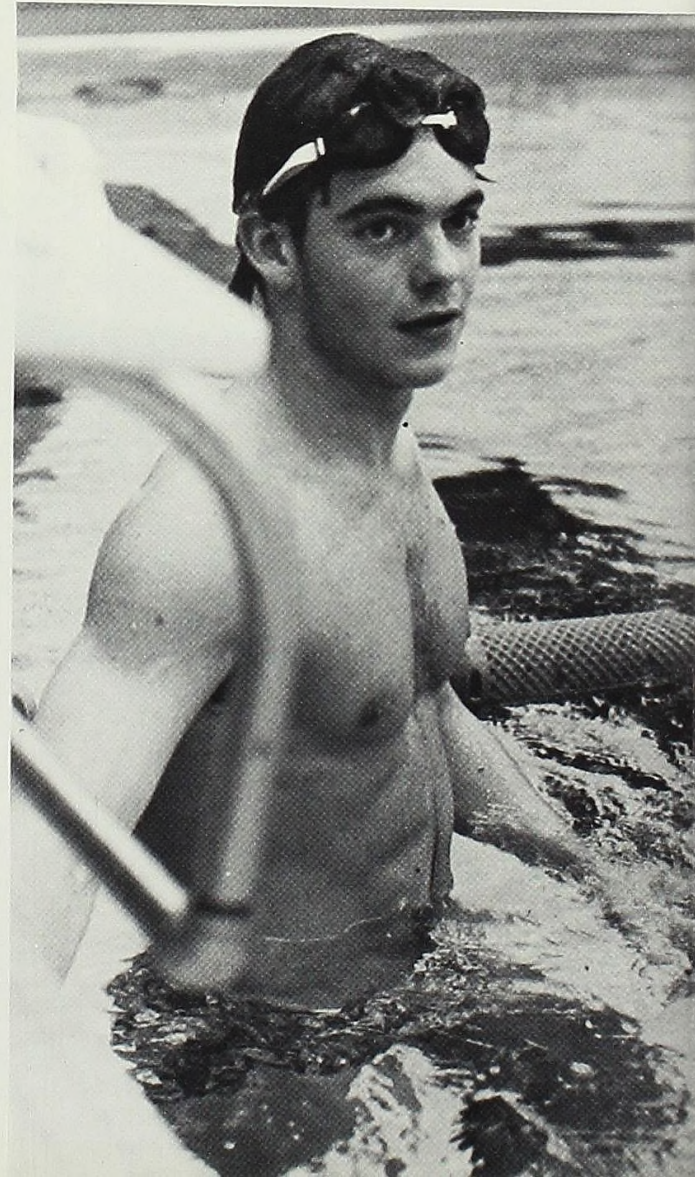
Men's Swimming

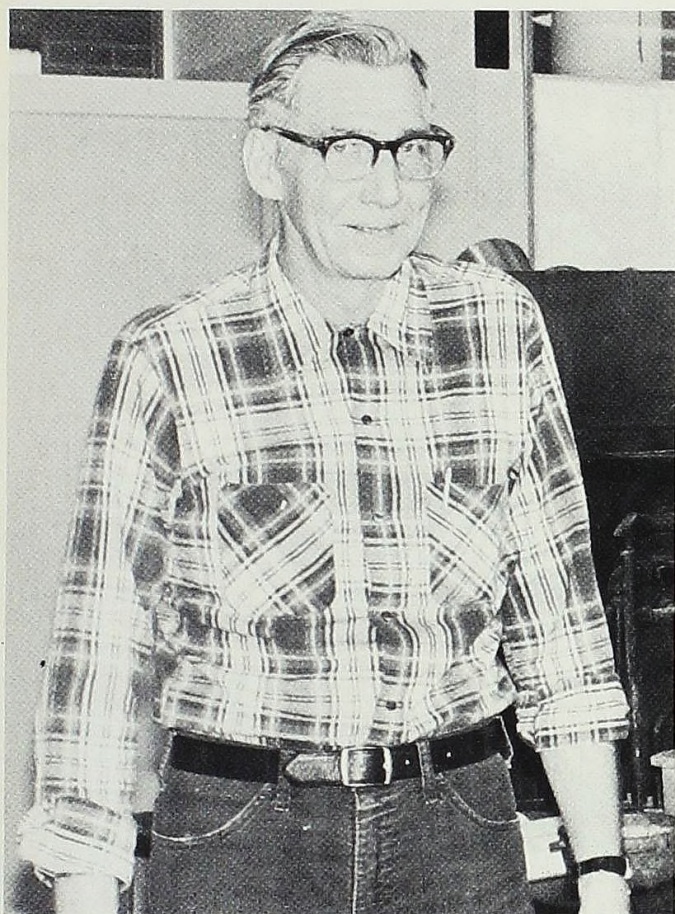
Astronomy
